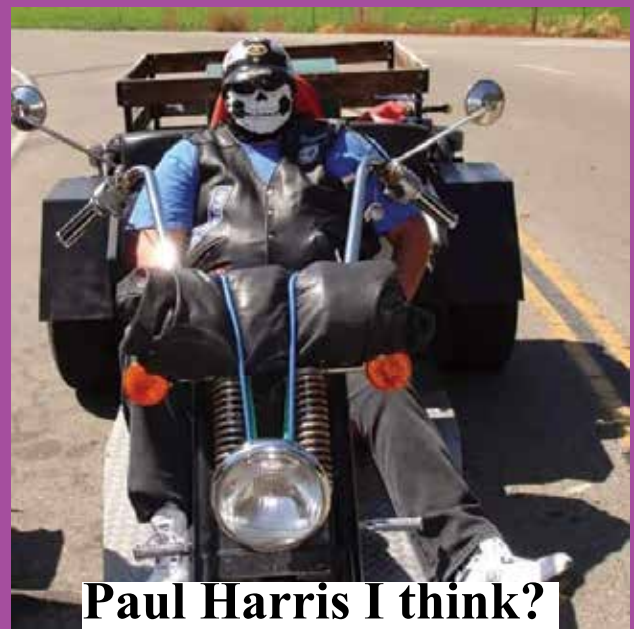

AMCN Membership Terms and Conditions

AirMedCare Network is an alliance of affiliated air ambulance providers* (each a "Company"). An AirMedCare Network membership automatically enrolls you as a member in each Company's membership program. Membership ensures the patient will have no out-of-pocket flight expenses if flown by a Company by providing prepaid protection against a Company's air ambulance costs that are not covered by a member's insurance or other benefits or third party responsibility, subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. Patient transport will be to the closest appropriate medical facility for medical conditions that are deemed by AMCN Provider attending medical professionals to be life- or limb-threatening, or that could lead to permanent disability, and which require emergency air ambulance transport. A patient's medical condition, not membership status, will dictate whether or not air transportation is appropriate and required. Under all circumstances, an AMCN Provider retains the sole right and responsibility to determine whether or not a patient is flown.
2. AMCN Provider air ambulance services may not be available when requested due to factors beyond its control, such as use of

regulations, maintenance requirements, patient condition, age or size, or weather conditions. FAA restrictions prohibit most AMCN Provider aircraft from flying in inclement weather conditions. The primary determinant of whether to accept a flight is always the safety of the patient and medical flight crews. Emergent ground ambulance transport of a member by an AMCN Provider will be covered under the same terms and conditions.

3. Members who have insurance or other benefits, or third party responsibility claims, that cover the cost of ambulance services are financially liable for the cost of AMCN Provider services up to the limit of any such available coverage. In return for payment of the membership fee, the AMCN Provider will consider its air ambulance costs that are not covered by any insurance, benefits or third party responsibility available to the member to have been fully prepaid. The AMCN Provider reserves the right to bill directly any appropriate insurance, benefits provider or third party for services rendered, and members authorize their insurers, benefits providers and responsible third parties to pay any covered amounts directly to the AMCN Provider. Members agree to remit to the AMCN Provider

Network is an insurance company. Membership is not an insurance policy and cannot be considered as a secondary insurance coverage or a supplement to any insurance coverage. **Neither the Company nor AirMedCare Network will be responsible for payment for services provided by another ambulance service.**

4. Membership starts 15 days after the Company receives a complete application with full payment; however, the waiting period will be waived for unforeseen events occurring during such time. Members must be natural persons. Memberships are non-refundable and non-transferable.
5. Some state laws prohibit Medicaid beneficiaries from being offered membership or being accepted into membership programs. By applying, members certify to the Company that they are not Medicaid beneficiaries.
6. These terms and conditions supersede all previous terms and conditions between a member and the Company or AirMedCare Network, including any other writings, or verbal representations, relating to the terms and conditions of membership.

Angels On The Road

CHAPTER 6 CONTINUED FROM LAST ISSUE

Our destination for the end of the day was a good one hundred miles ahead of us. At Wallenberg, there was a gas station sitting out in the middle of wide open spaces. Sky and highway as far as the eye can see. We stretched our legs and had a cup of coffee. Even though I have a spare tank, I like to keep the main one full, so I topped it off. Lee said his was good. Lee also used this stop to call his mom, my Aunt Irene, in Waterloo, Iowa. We never told Aunt Irene that I was having a trike built or that we planned to ride back to Iowa for the family reunion. She thought he was alone on this trip, and wanted him to check in. Lee had to be so careful not to let on that I was there and spoil the surprise! After Lee made the call, and we were finishing our coffee I looked back the way we had come. The sky had turned a dark gray and there were threatening rain clouds coming in. I was hesitant to head out, but the station closed at night and there wasn't lodging. We climbed on the trikes and headed out at a fast clip. Pueblo, was fifty miles ahead and I wasn't confident that we would make it there before the rain hit. The famous last words of a biker, we can out run it, was the beginning of a new adventure. The first down pour caught up to us about 25 miles from Pueblo. The first big cold rain drops hit the back of my neck and ran slowly down. Pueblo was approximately fifty miles straight down the road. I was enjoying the meadows stretched out into the horizon. I use the word meadow because there were no working fields, as I know them, nor were there cattle grazing. No fences anywhere. Compared to home in Wisconsin, seeing the wide open spaces were a real treat. There wasn't a hill or curve anywhere to break up the horizon. I thought how small and insignificant it made me feel, a speck on the road, to be out here with nothing but space and sky wrapped around me. I wondered too, if I was riding in a car, would I feel the same sense of smallness?

The storm clouds brewing over my shoulder were coming on fast. We kept at a good pace, but the storm was going to overtake us. Cruising at 70mph, the storm my back; then the sky opened up blinding us as the rain washed over us.

I was having trouble seeing the road. I kept the right wheel on the white line on the side of the road. We were traveling fast, with water spraying off the front tires, right back at our legs. I had a full face helmet, but the face shield steamed up. Lee had a half helmet and was taking the brunt of the rain, right in his face. When I lifted the shield the rain pelted my face and stung my eyes. With, or without, the shield, I was riding blind most of the time. Lee was in the lead, keeping up a good clip, when the back end of a u-haul suddenly appeared in front of his wheel. He didn't have time to brake, but swerved into the left lane. Thank God there wasn't any traffic coming.

We pulled over at an under pass to catch our breath and count our blessings. Lee was shaken by the near accident. I thought, it wasn't me this time! I didn't shut my trike off, because I was afraid it would be too wet to start again. In fact, I had been worrying because it had

started cutting out. Water was dripping off the bridge over-head causing a small water fall. Climbing, stiff and cold, off the trikes we tried to shake the water from our clothes. When we put our arms down, the water RAN out of our sleeves. Pulling off my riding gloves was a feat. My hands were wet and frozen. The gloves were molded to my fingers. Finally I decided to leave them on. They might be wet, but they were still warmer and gave some protection from the wind. There wasn't a let-up in the rain for another fifteen miles. Frozen, tired, and hungry, I was looking forward to a hot shower, food, and early to bed. The exit to Pueblo couldn't come soon enough. This had to be the longest fifty miles of the whole trip, and I just wanted it over. I had taken the lead when the exit sign for Pueblo appeared. Finally! I looked back to give Lee thumbs up. He wasn't behind me! I pulled over and looked back. Lee was sitting on the bridge I had just passed over. I walked back to see what the problem was. ONE FREAKING MILE from the exit, and he RAN OUT OF GAS! Neither one of us had a gas can. We decided to push his trike up to mine then drain from my spare tank. The rain had finally stopped, but it was getting close to dark and a chill was setting in. Of course worse for us, because we were wet! As I was pushing the trike the heel of my right boot fell off. "Oh, for heaven sake, what next! Wet, cold, stiff, tired, hungry, and limping behind a trike out of gas, we made our way down the road.

Searching our soggy luggage, I found a 1.93 oz Energy Enhancer bottle. Lee found a plastic tube for siphoning. Working from the spare tank we siphoned ounce..... by ounce..... by ounce..... finally we had a half pint. Lee had a headache from the fumes and gas. My patience was pretty near gone, as was my good humor? GONE! BUT the worst was yet to come! Getting his trike started, we once again headed for the exit, and the first gas station available. Which, thank God was a half block off the highway! While filling up, we asked about the location of the nearest lodging. Camping wasn't an option! The news wasn't good! The nearest hotels or motels were on the west side of town, about two miles away. BUT, the really bad news..... there was a BIG CAR SHOW in town! By this time, it was early evening, the temperature was dropping, and I just wanted to be dry and warm.

The two miles to the Westside exit seemed like ten. We pulled into the parking lot of the first motel, but there was no vacancy, nor at the next, or the next, or the next. Seeing a restaurant up ahead, we headed for it. We needed hot food. It had been hours since we had eaten or been warm. We needed to regroup. As we stepped through the door of the restaurant, all heads turned to look. It was as if someone called a head to say, "Watch for the drowned bikers!" Every step we took there was a squish, squish, squish! Along with the squish, squish, add a squish, limp, squish, limp, all the way to the counter. I was too cold to be totally embarrassed. Lee just plan didn't care. I looked at the people watching, and made myself feel better by thinking if anyone in that restaurant was a biker, they knew exactly how we were feeling.

I wrapped my hands around that heavenly, hot, mug of coffee and let it slowly slip down my throat. As the coffee did its job, I started to feel a chill. The kind of chill that comes when there is warmth in the room, but your clothes are soaked. I envisioned being sick if I didn't get

out of the wet clothes I had been in for hours. It was nearly 8:30pm and we still had no place to stay. Then our waitress came over and said she had called an 800 number and found us a room if we were interested. I took the phone from her and gave her a big smile. It was the last room available, it was suite. I whipped out the GOLD and asked for directions. No problem they would save the room. ONE little inconvenience.....the Best Western was 30 miles in the opposite direction. We thanked the waitress, tipped her very well, apologized for the wet stools and the puddles under them, and left the last warmth we would feel for a while.

Back on the bikes, still wet. Still cold and exhausted we headed for Canon City. It was after 9:00pm. I was so cold my knees shook against the gas tank. My fingers were stiff, I could barely keep the throttle open. With every mile, I didn't think I could make it the next. I couldn't remember ever being so miserable. I became aware of horn behind me. Since it was a passing zone on a straight way, with no cars coming, why didn't they just pass? PASS ALL READY! What was missing was no lights to go with the horn. THEN...I realized it was MY horn blowing. On a dark night, when all is quiet the sound of a horn can be very loud. Lee had figured out it was my horn and was already pulling over. I pulled in behind him. With a flashlight he disconnected some wires; and the horn shut off. Back on the road, I shifted into 4th gear and the horn went off again! In tandem, we pulled off the road. Even in the dark, I could see Lee's patience was gone. He rushed back to my trike, (minus the flashlight the batteries were dead), took a hand full of wires and pulled! I was beyond reason by then and was laughing hysterically, knees hammering the gas tank. I saw the wires hanging and couldn't believe my lights were still on, and the trike running, BUT with NO HORN! Lee walked calmly back to his trike, revved it up, gave it throttle throwing gravel, was down the road. I was still laughing when, I too, pulled out on the highway and tore out after him. We were beyond cold so we rode as fast as we could to the bright lights of Canon City, and what we hoped would be lodging.

Pulling into the Best Western we were barely able to pull our frozen, exhausted bodies off the trikes. From the corner of my eye, I saw a car pull in. My guardian angels must have seen them too, because I immediately got the message to "hurry in and get your room!" I must have looked like a lunatic running into the hotel with leathers dripping and a clip, clump. The man at the registration desk took one look at me and I knew I had forgotten to tell him we were coming in on bikes. I didn't give him a chance to recover, nor to let the man behind me get any closer. I shouted.....I CALLED! The man behind me swore.

Our room was on the 2nd floor, outside entrance. Our leather bags were so wet they dripped, and of course, weighed a ton. I could barely lift mine and half pulled them to the stairway. On the landing, I stopped and was so grateful when Lee came back to help me. I was near tears. WELL ACTUALLY, I had already shed a few. The rain, cold, the horn, had taken their toll, and I was near collapse.

We unrolled sleeping bags on the floor to dry. Hung leathers to drip and took every item out of the cases and hung them on chairs, sconces, lamps, and shower care. Some never cur-

tains. Driver's license, insurance cards, anything paper was unfolded with infinite to be readable again. While I took a hot shower, Lee went to find food. Nothing was open, of course, so we ended up with vending food. But hey....it was food. Hot Chocolate, some fruit and for a veggie Lee brought back a piece of carrot cake, Lee humor, which I ended up sitting on. I turned up the heat to high, wrapped up in every available blanket, Lee hadn't already gotten to, and snuggled into bed. As the silence filled the room, we started to laugh. What a day it had been, but an adventure never the less! Finally drifting off to sleep I gave thanks for the warm blankets in a warm room.

When I woke up in the morning, Lee was already up and gone. I found some dry clothes and hurriedly dressed. The lack of food was evident with the growling of my stomach. I was warm, dry, and ready to get going. Lee came in and said he had checked out the trikes. Rewired my trike, putting them back where they belonged. Lee couldn't figure out why the horn had shorted out, but it wouldn't do that again! It was disconnected for the duration of the trip. Lee was acting as if he had something to tell me, but didn't want to. I looked at him and said, "What?" He said, I fixed your throttle cable. "Why did you do that?" I asked. Because, he said, it was ready to break. I don't know how we made it here. I just stood there looking at him remembering the cold, wet wild ride in the dark. That is one thing we couldn't have fixed on the road. I literally felt the presence of my guardian angels. There was no doubt in my mind that they had held that throttle cable together on our wild ride through the night. Humbled, doesn't cover the way I was feeling.

Chapter 7

Our first priority, in the morning before, leaving Canon City, was a big, hot, breakfast. LOTS of hot coffee, eggs, bacon, and hash browns. Food never tasted so good! After being soaked from the rain, our clothes needed to be washed, so I headed for the laundry. The leather travel bags were still damp, so we lined them with black garbage bags, and packed the clean clothes inside. A day on the road, in the wind, would dry the leather.

As we headed out of town, on Highway 50, our last stop was Wal-Mart, for rain gear, and next door advertising shoes and boots on sale. Limping was becoming second nature which means my back and hips would soon start complaining. The spiffy rain gear we bought, brought good luck, it didn't rain the rest of the trip. Packed up and ready to hit the road, we headed back to Pueblo. Destination Colorado Springs.

At Pueblo we turned on 87/85 - 25 and rode past Pueblo West. I was thrilled to put the town behind us. The sun was shining, I was dry, and I had boots, with HEELS! I am so easily pleased! I had arranged to pick up my spare pair of glasses at the Federal Express in Colorado Springs. I couldn't believe I hadn't developed headaches, since I had been without them for days. We needed to get there before they closed, so we had to keep up a good pace, with no stops that weren't necessary.

As we approached Colorado Springs, the two lanes became three lanes of very fast moving traffic. Because I didn't know the area, or, exactly where the exit was I didn't know what

lane I should be in. Lee was in the lead, and said he knew which exit we needed. When I could, I stayed in the right lane. Traffic was busier than I liked. I was having trouble with the throttle, again, and if I had to get off I needed the right lane. I was having a problem keeping the throttle open. I ended up riding two miles with both hands gripping the handle bar for all I was worth. Even with me holding tight, the trike started to slow. Thank heavens the exit came before I stopped dead in my tracks, in busy traffic. There wasn't any traffic coming, so I didn't bother to slow or stop at the stop sign. We pulled into the parking lot of the Federal Express Building. My hands hurt from gripping the handle bar, and my fingers were so cramped, it hurt to straighten them out.

It was such a relief to finally have glasses again. I didn't realize how my eyes must have been strained without them. When I put them on, I noticed right away, the tension behind my eyes lessened. It wasn't something I was aware of until then. While I had been in getting my glasses, Lee fixed the throttle, again! A minor adjustment, he said.

For some reason, neither one of us could figure out, we lost our way, when we left Colorado Springs. We had left the three lane traffic and was on a country road. I think, we thought it was a short cut, but then we know how that turns out! Where we thought, we would come to the road we wanted, there was only more side roads. Looking at the map wasn't a help, because we had no idea where we were. Our maps didn't show avenues, lanes, or county roads. By some miracle we stumbled onto Highway 24, where we should have been all along. We were now, behind schedule. We had planned to make Limon by nightfall but, we didn't make it.

We were riding in hill country when the wind began to blow the trikes from one side of the road to the other. Lee's trike was shorter and lighter than mine, so I was surprised when I had a problem with keeping mine steady. Then, I noticed the sky looked funny....sort of a yellowish green. NO, it couldn't be a tornado? We road down out of the hills into a little town called, Calhan. A woman came out of the station as soon as we pulled up and told us to take cover because, indeed, there was a tornado watch. In fact, the next couple of days were to be "iffy" weather. We asked the lady if there was a motel nearby. She directed us up the street. When we thought about it later, if we hadn't gotten lost, we would have been in open country with little or no cover. Could our guardian angels have been at work again?

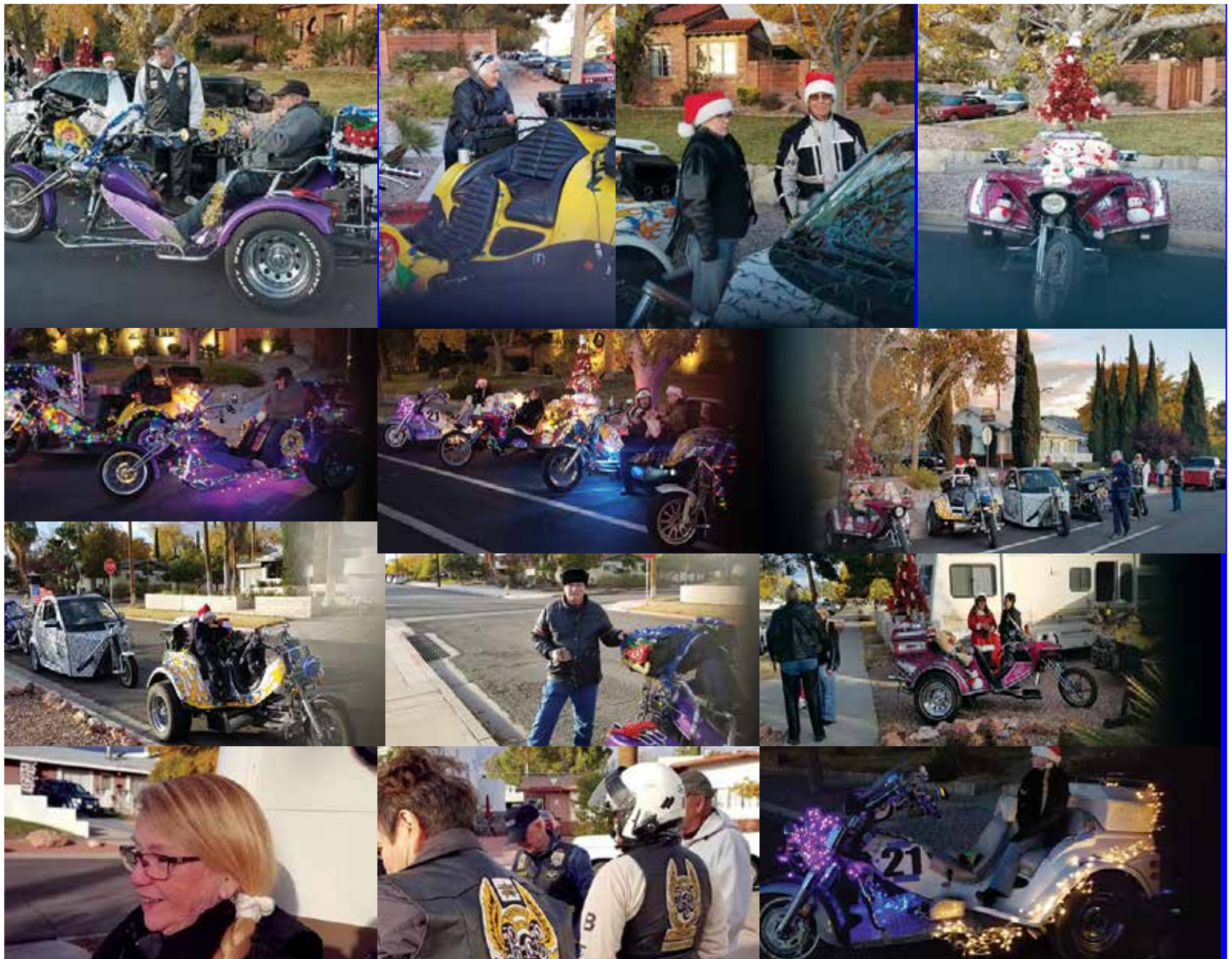

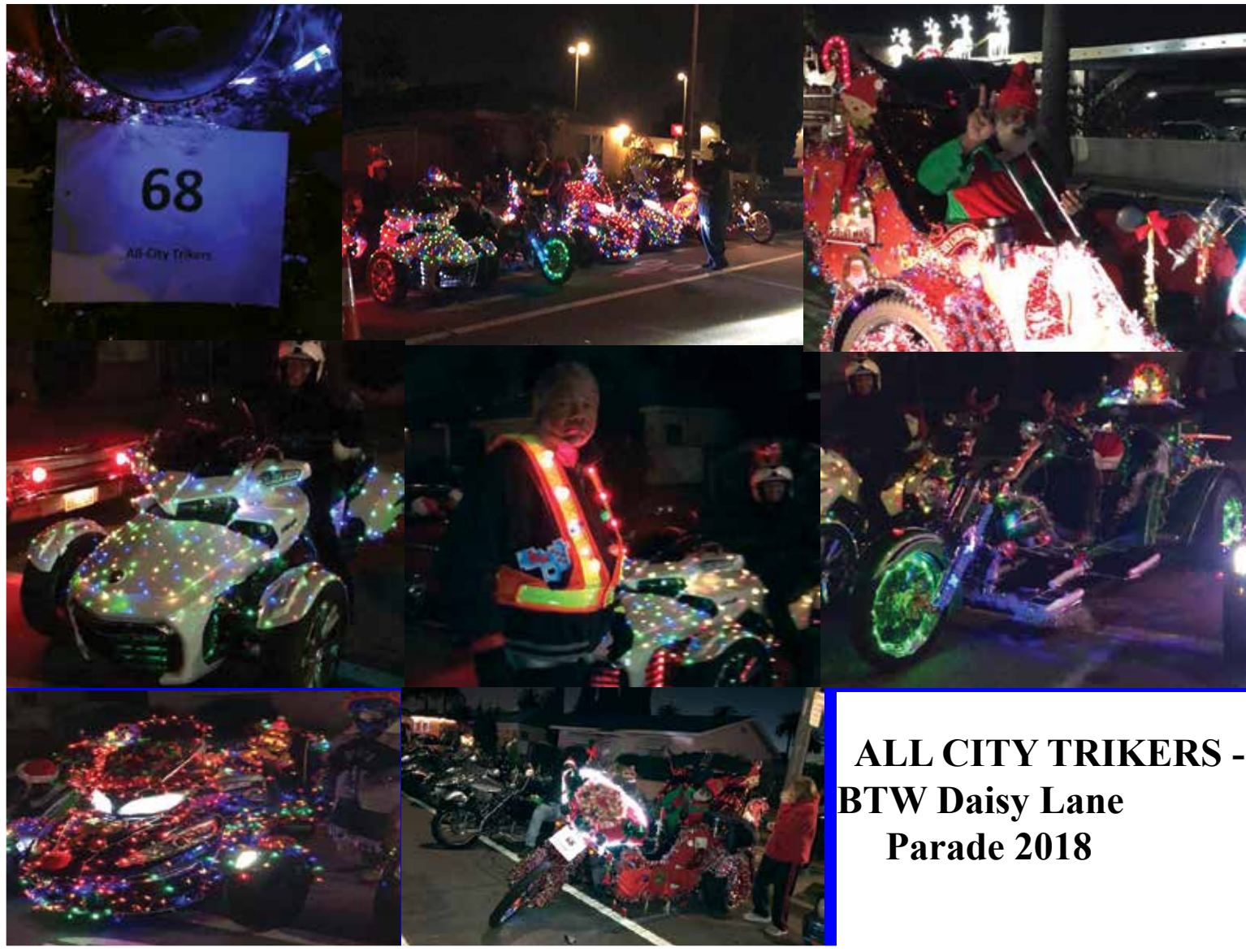

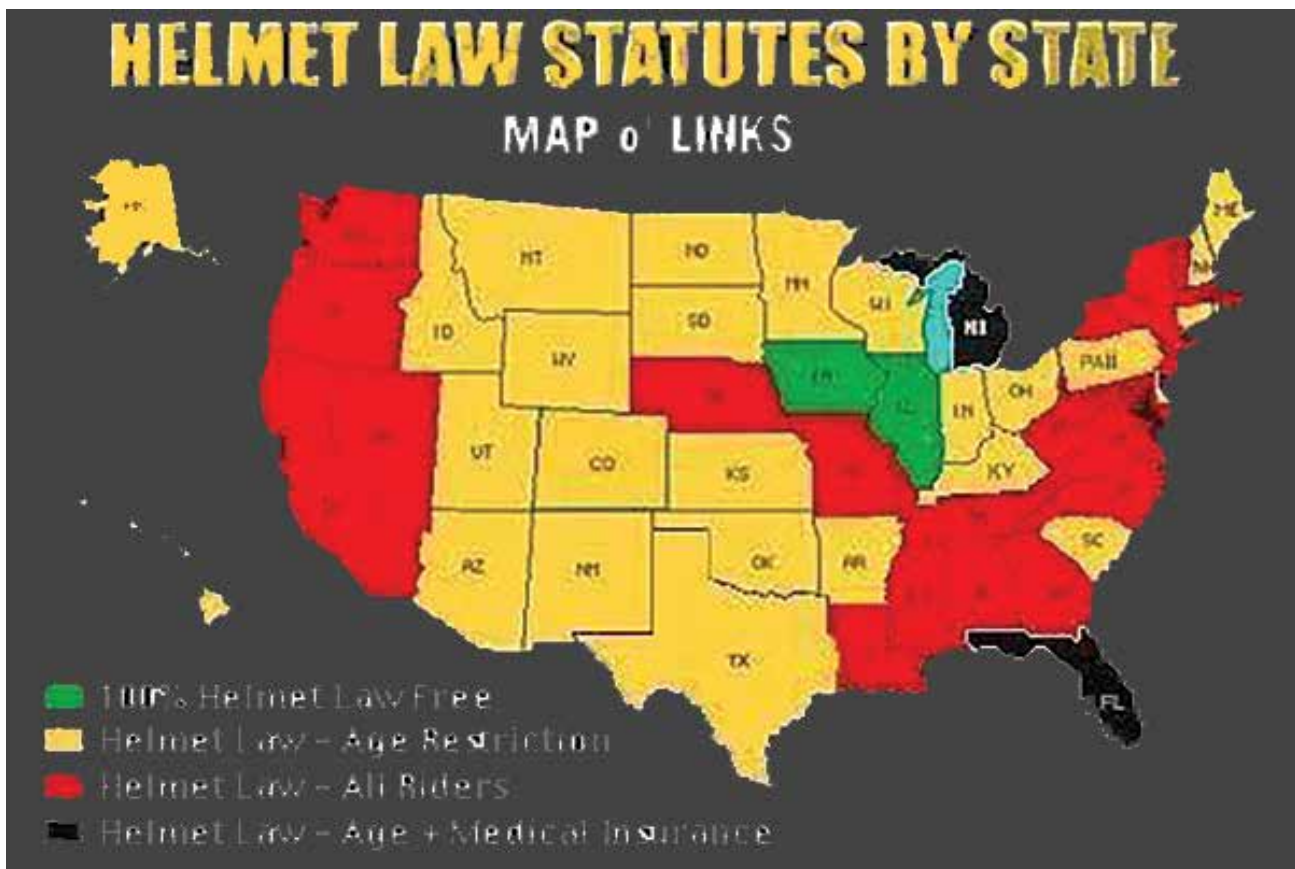

BTW BOD Elections
