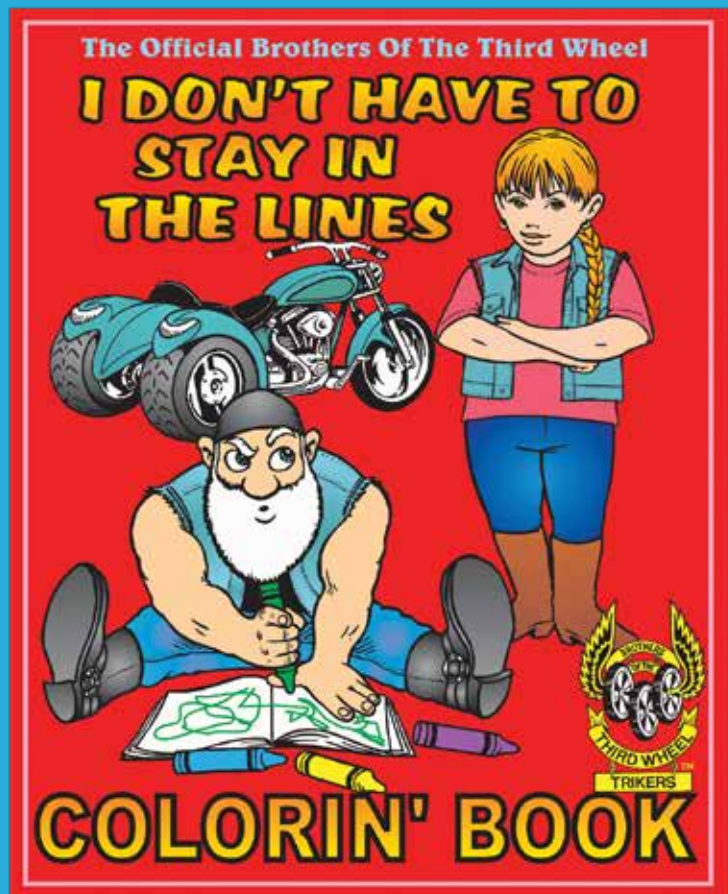

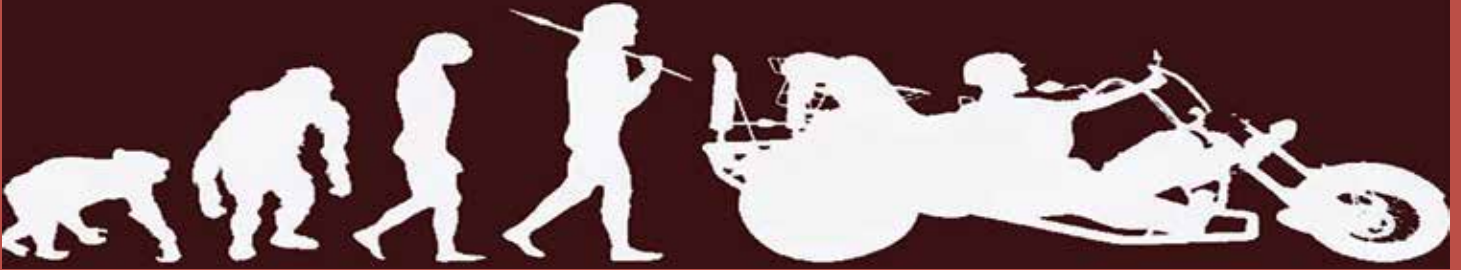

We made sure to hand pick the motels on the way back, so not to disrupt any working ladies this time.

Route 66 became quite a challenge as much of it was closed for repairs in patches and we were sent back on the freeway. Finding where to get back on became a bit crazy, where in fact, after finding what we thought was where we should be we found out we were going back the wrong way, as it winds around so much, never sure which

We are now on the 14th day and leaving NM for home and feeling real good about doing the whole trip, in spite of some issues. As we are just coming to Benson, AZ about 60 miles from home when a wheel passes, us and a loud screeching starts. As I look back I see it is our little trailers

wheel and the screeching is the aluminum fender dragging down the highway making beautiful sparks and smoke. Sooo we pull over and turn the trailer over to find that the axle got cracked in that good old Missouri ditch but at least held on until now. So we unhooked what's left of the trailer, hide it in the bushes next to the guard rail and go into Benson, rent a small trailer big enough to carry our little one and back on the highway to get ours. Heading back east to get to where the trailer is, an 18 wheeler pulled out in front of us and the other 18 wheeler beside us is also not slowing down. I am either going to hit one of them or blast between them and get out of the way, which I did and good old Venom hit 100 for a few seconds pulling the heavy rental trailer. We turn around to pick up the little trailer and as we stop, Venom boils over from the high speed towing the big rental trailer. So out with the 2 bottles of water we had left and into the radiator, load our trailer on to the rental and chug home at 45 mph. While loading the broken trailer 2 other things happened, first we got a call from our granddaughter who was house sitting that our dog was foaming at the mouth and staggering which in Arizona usually means they have eaten a Colorado river toad, which are deadly to dogs. Next, while I am trying to load the trailer, I knocked out one of my teeth, just to complete the whole scenario. Halfway home we get another call that the dog seems to be ok, which brought the blood pressure down a few notches. We get home all ok and unload the trailer as we have to take the trailer back to Benson the next morning. As I am unloading, I read on the trailer that I can do a one way deal and just have to contact the office here in Tucson, which I did and they informed me that I could arrange to do that but because I did not arrange that prior to the rental it would be \$330, instead of \$30, as it is called a wrong destination fee. Needless to say, I made a trip to Benson the next morning to take the trailer back and we also met a nice young lady working at the rental agency, who had just bought a new trike and wanted to join BTW, which made this run well worth it. Ok, so 3 days go by and we start smelling gas fumes in the garage and when we check the 20'x 5' carpet that the trike sits on, is totally immersed in fuel from the trike gas line leak caused by junk in the grass, in that same Missouri ditch we visited on the trip. I am now proficient in carpet fuel removal if you're ever in need.

So, 3500 miles in 9 days, plus a great 3 day event, new air ride, new trailer parts and Venom repairs, has made for a very memorable trip. Still having dreams and NIGHTMARES about it. My shrink says, give it time and I will be OK again.

PHOTOS THAT WE RECEIVE AT HQ IN 72 PIXELS ARE RUN THROUGH A PROGRAM TO CLEAN THEM UP BUT NOT MUCH HAPPENS AS THE BASE IS SO LOW THAT THE PROGRAM CAN ONLY LIGHTEN OR DARKEN THEM. Arm extended straight up with palm facing forward



### COME AROUND/ TAKE THE LEAD

Arm extended index finger pointing out while swinging arc from back to front

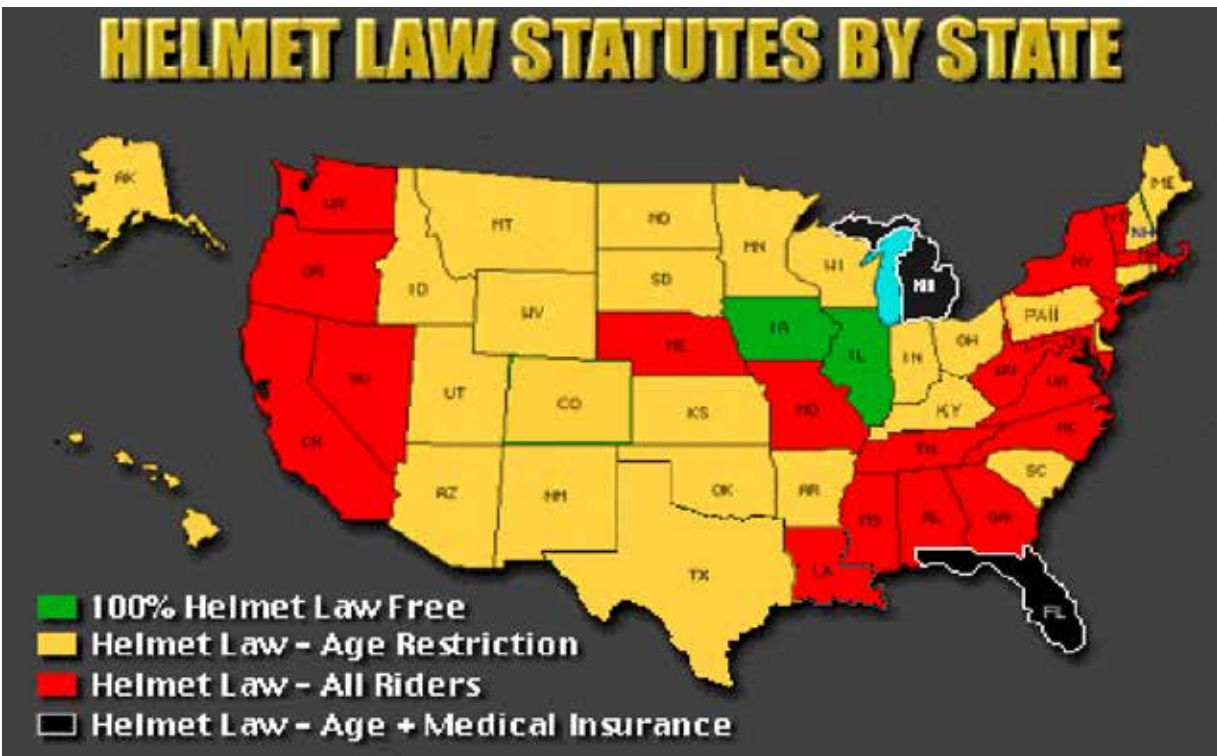

### •Footnotes

1. Alaska's motorcycle helmet use law covers passengers of all ages, operators younger than 18, and operators with instructional permits.
- 2 In Delaware, every motorcycle operator or rider age 19 and older must carry an approved helmet.
- 3 In Florida, the law requires that all riders younger than 21 years wear helmets, without exception. Those 21 years and older may ride without helmets only if they can show proof that they are covered by a medical insurance policy.
- 4 In Kentucky, motorcycle helmet laws also cover operators with instructional/learner's permits.
- 5 Motorcycle helmet laws in Maine cover operators with instructional/learner's permits and operators in their first year of licensure. Maine's motorcycle helmet use law also covers passengers 17 and younger and passengers riding with operators who are required to wear a helmet.
- 6 In Michigan, the law requires that all riders younger than 21 wear helmets, without exception. Those 21 and older may ride without helmets only if they carry additional insurance and have passed a motorcycle safety course or have had their motorcycle endorsement for at least two years. Motorcycle passengers who want to exercise this option also must be 21 or older and carry additional insurance.
- 7 Motorcycle helmet laws in Minnesota cover operators with instructional/learner's permits.
- 8 In Missouri, riders younger than 26 and instruction permit holders, regardless of age, must wear protective headgear when the vehicle is in motion. Operators who are 26 and older may operate a motorcycle without protective headgear if they maintain proof of financial responsibility. No person shall be stopped, inspected, or detained solely to determine compliance.
- 9 North Dakota's motorcycle helmet use law covers all passengers traveling with operators who are covered by the law.
- 10 Ohio's motorcycle helmet use law covers all operators during the first year of licensure and all passengers of operators who are covered by the law.
- 11 Pennsylvania's motorcycle helmet use law covers all operators during the first two years of licesure unless the operator has completed the safety course approved by PennDOT or the Motorcycle Safety Foundation.
- 12 Rhode Island's motorcycle helmet use law covers all passengers (regardless of age) and all operators during the first year of licensure (regardless of age).
- 13 Texas exempts riders 21 or older if they can either show proof of successfully completing a motorcycle operator training & safety course or can show proof of having a medical insurance policy. Peace officers may not stop or detain a person who is the operator of or a passenge on a motorcycle for the sole purpose of determining whether the person has successfully completed the motorcycle operator training and safety course or is covered by a healt insurance plan.
- 14 Motorcycle helmet laws in Wisconsin cover operators with instructional/learner's permits.

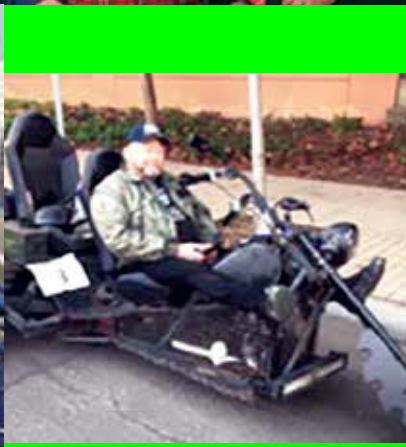
NEW MAP AS OF JULY 2022

## **BTW BOD Elections**

BTW is split into 10 Regions; 9 of these regions are in the USA and Canada and the final one covers all areas outside of the USA & Canada. Each Region has a Regional Director. The Regional Directors serve as the Board of Directors. The Board makes decisions regarding the running of BTW, with each Regional Director being elected for a three-year term by the Directors in their Regions. 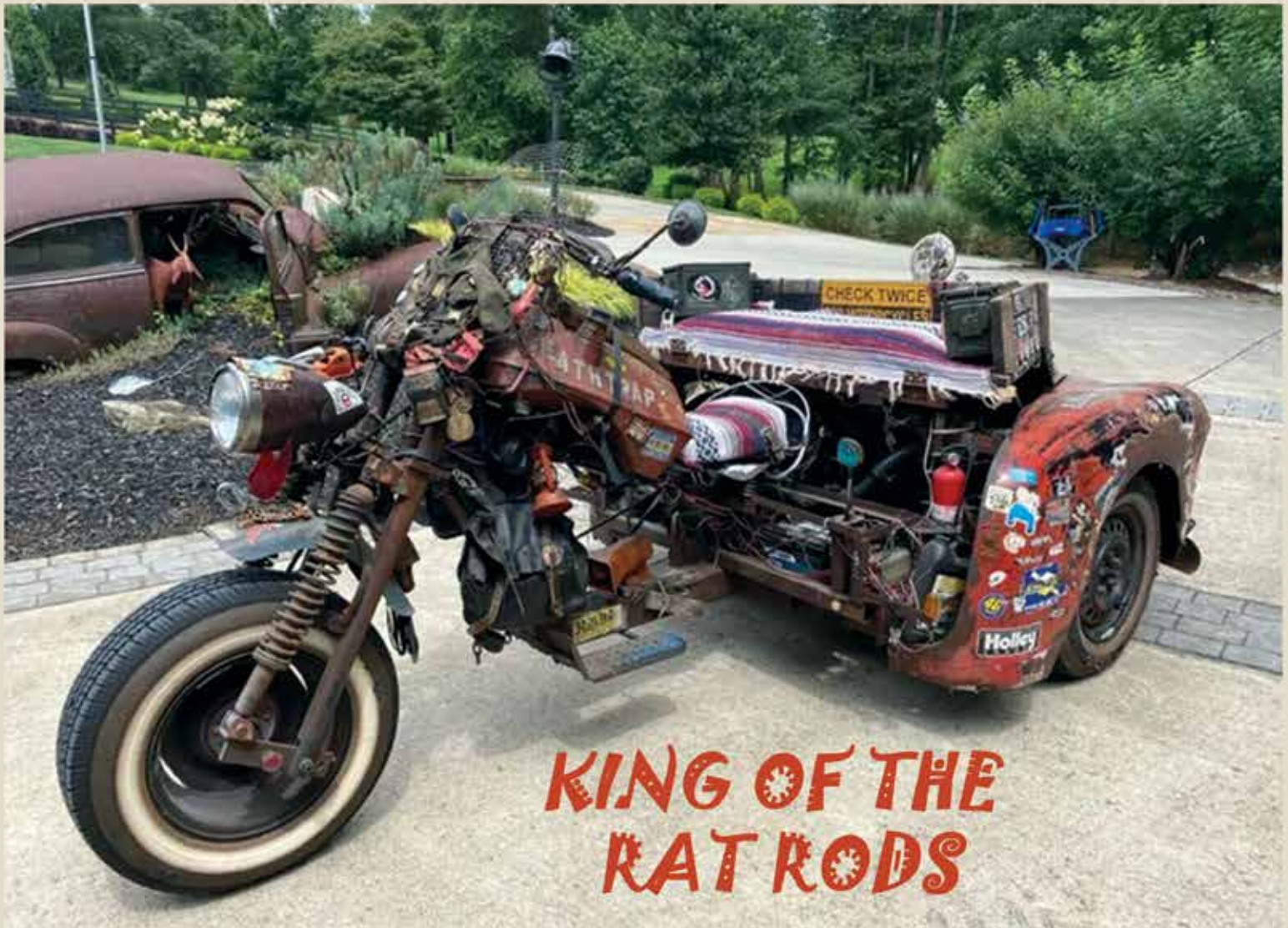
