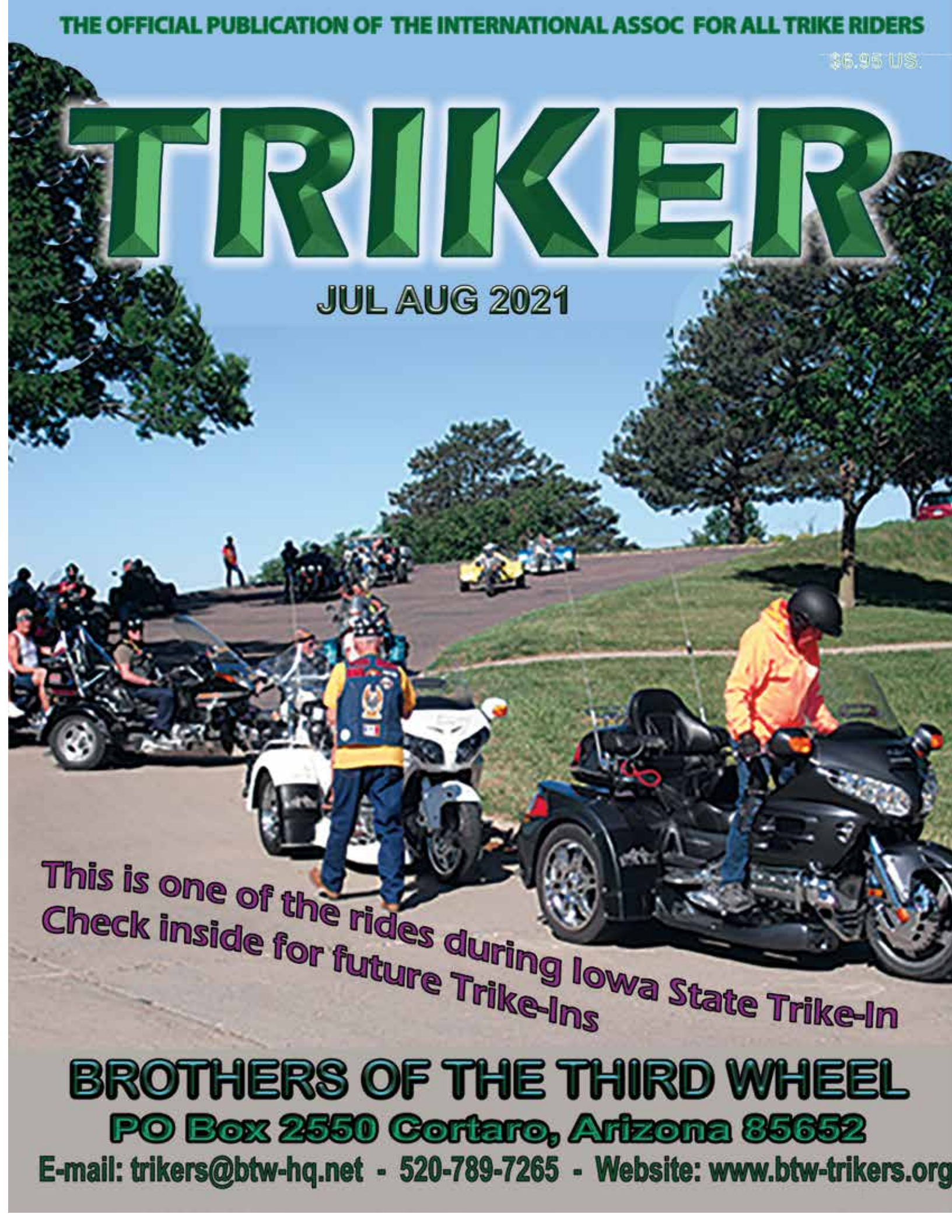

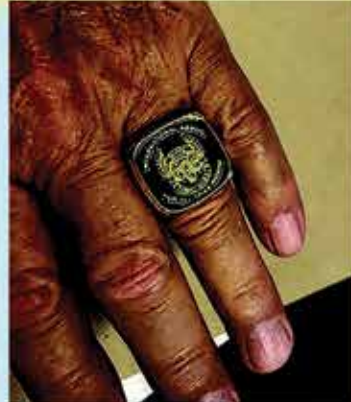

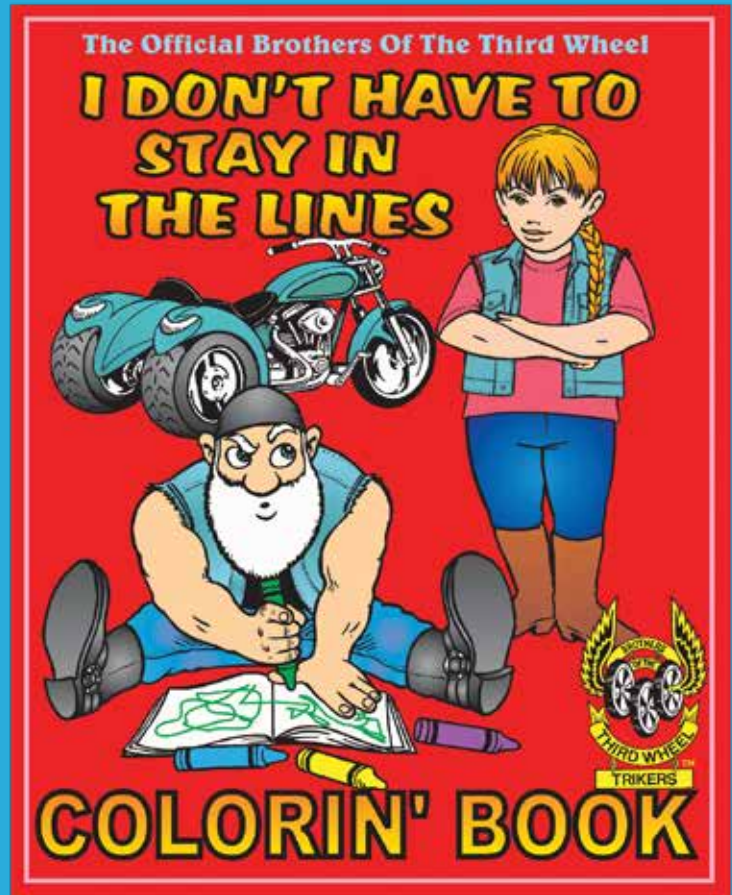

To Hell and Back Written by Jerry Domagala

That's Hells Canyon National Recreation Area to be more specific. I left my home in Bellingham, WA and headed for Hells Canyon on May 13th driving my Polaris Slingshot. On my first day I crossed the North Cascades Highway, Hwy 20, which is one of the most spectacular roads I have ever ridden on but that's for another story. The weather was beautiful and the road was clear and dry. This highway is closed during the winter and had just reopened the week before. On my first day I drove to Moses Lake, WA which is just under 300 miles from Bellingham. I stayed at an inexpensive family-owned motel. Since I can't really recommend the motel, I won't divulge the name of it. It wasn't really bad, but it wasn't great either. If it was terrible, I'd let you know.



This was the second time I was going to Hells Canyon. The first time, last year, I followed the route I found in Motorcycle Journeys Through the Pacific Northwest written by Bruce Hansen, second edition. For more details regarding highways and distances I recommend buying his book. In the book the directions start at the south end but since this was my second time, I reversed it and started at the north end. If I had started from the south, I would not have completed the trip. The reason for that comes later in my story. My second day I headed to Enterprise, OR. The day starts off driving on some nice scenic roads but nothing too spectacular (since I live in the Pacific NW it takes a lot to impress me.) but before you get to Enterprise you ride on one of the most curvy roads I have ever been on. I'm not sure of the exact mileage but the fun part is probably between 25 and 50 miles. In Enterprise I stayed at the Wilderness Inn which I would highly recommend. It's not fancy but the rooms are comfortable and clean. The added benefit to staying there is that it is next door to La Laguna, one of the best Mexican restaurants I've been to in the US. I ate there last year and picked the hotel because it was next to it. When I got up Sunday morning, I stopped to get a latte at a little coffee place. The woman who was working there was really nice and asked where I was headed. When I told her she said she didn't know if what they call the 39 road (highway 39) was open yet. That should have told me something but since I didn't have any time constraints I figured if the road was closed, I would just go somewhere else.



When I got to the start of highway 39 I noticed a yellow sign that said the road was not maintained for public travel from October 15 – June 15. That was the second hint maybe I won't make it all the way to Hells Canyon but again I figured if the road was closed, I'd just turn around and find somewhere else to

go. So off I went heading down this beautiful road. The first thing I noticed was the amount of rocks on the road. What was interesting was that they were usually on my side of the road but since there was no one else on the first part of this road, going around them wasn't a big problem. As things progressed, I started to see more snow along the sides of the road and then I started to have to go around the snow on my side.



Eventually the snow patches started to spill over to the other side of the road. I think it would be fair to say that even though Slingshots were made by a company known for their snowmobiles they really suck on anything but dry pavement. There were a few times that my butt puckered when I couldn't keep my rear wheel out of the snow and I started to slide a little. None of the patches of snow was more than about 10 or 15 yards long but it was still a little hairy at times. Every time I thought that the road was improving there would

be either a section of snow or rocks to drive around. Then there was the tree. It had fallen and landed at about a 45 degree angle totally blocking my side of the road and part of the other side too. It looked like someone might have cut the top off but I'm not sure. I was able to get by because I was low enough for my right front fender to fit under some of the branches. Actually, I made it sound worse than it was. But it was very unusual for me to drive for about 30 miles at 25mph or less on a road with a 55mph speed limit. The scenery was spectacular and I only saw 2 other vehicles on the first half of this highway. As I got closer to the end of the road there were more and more vehicles on the road and the conditions were a lot better but you still had to watch out for the rocks. When I reached the south end of the road there was the same yellow sign saying the road wasn't being maintained yet. The big difference is that there was also a large barricade blocking people from entering that said "Road Closed". A lot of people were driving around the sign but if I was going north I would have turned around and not driven it.



At the end of the road I headed towards Copperville. I needed fuel before heading into Hells Canyon itself and stopped at a station with a small convenience store. After filling up with gas I went into the store to look for something to eat. The man working there, who I think is the owner, asked me if I was looking for food. I told him I was and he said a new restaurant just opened 2 doors down. When I pulled up at the restaurant I didn't look at the sign they had next to the road. When I got out of my Slingshot a woman came out and said that they were having a "soft" opening and invited me in. It turns out the sign by the road said "Opening Soon". I was their first customer and while I was eating, they changed the sign to "Open". The name on the front of the restaurant said "Hells Canyon Inn and Cafe". I had a pulled pork sandwich that was delicious. It's a family run business and besides good food everyone was really nice. I hope their restaurant is a success. Try to plan a stop there, you won't be sorry.



After lunch I headed into Hells Canyon itself. The road is only about 20 miles long and ends at the visitor center just past the dam. It's a

fun little twisty road that was in really good shape. It was a fun drive but the Visitor Center was closed which didn't surprise me. I'm not sure if it was closed because of Covid or it wasn't open for the year yet. If you're into camping, there are several camping places along this road right on the Snake River.



Then it was off to Baker City, OR where the trip starts in the book I mentioned earlier. I stayed at the

Quality Inn Sunridge Inn and Conference Center in Baker City. This was the second time I stayed there and would recommend it. It has a restaurant and bar so you can relax and not have to go anywhere else to find a place to eat.

The next day I drove to Kennewick and stayed at the Best Western Plus Kennewick Inn. I had a very nice room at a very reasonable price but what impressed me most was their breakfast. Most of the hotels I have stayed at since the start of the pandemic have used it as

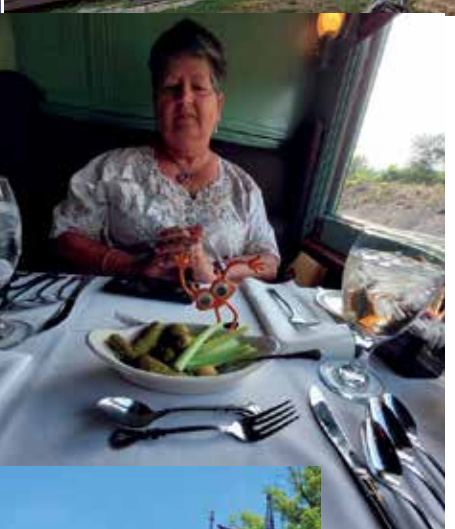
an excuse to cut back services. Most, who used to offer free breakfasts, have stopped "Due to Covid19" one even did away with free coffee in the lobby because of it. This hotel had a full buffet style breakfast, eggs, bacon, sausage, biscuits and gravy. Instead of cutting back they added a hand sanitizing station, plastic gloves, and required you to wear a mask. Needless to say, I recommend staying there if you're in the area. The only remarkable thing about my next day on the road was the wind. Most of the time I felt like someone was pushing on my shoulder but the pressure on my shoulder kept changing slightly. Then there were times I felt like I was riding a 2 wheeled motorcycle without a windshield. The only saving grace was that even though I was being pushed by the wind the Slingshot never did. I even let go of the wheel several times during gusts and I stayed straight as an arrow. I was bushed by the time I got to Winthrop, WA, where I would spend the last night of my trip at the Rio Vista Hotel. It's a nice hotel right on the Methow River. All the rooms have small balconies where you can sit and watch and listen to the river. It's only about a block and a half to the center of town so you can walk to the restaurants and shops in this old western style of town. And yes, I recommend the hotel I have stayed there before and will again. Leaving Winthrop the next day, I was concerned because the weather report said rain and possibly snow showers on the North Cascade Highway. I did see some snow flurries but the road didn't ice up. The only problem I had was it was really cold. My thermometer said it was 33 for about 20 minutes. It eventually warmed up to about 42 before it started to rain. I was more prepared for the rain than the intense cold, but I got home safely. I want to talk a little about the weather in the Hells Canyon Recreation Area. This time the temperature range was from about 40 to about 90 degrees. In the summer you can add about 10 or more degrees to both of these. I would take winter riding gear and also something like a cooling vest. I didn't have a cooling vest last summer so I would just ride along pouring water on my shirt. Being prepared for the temperature extremes will make your trip a lot more pleasant. Like I said before, if you want more details, buy the book that I wrote about earlier. Just so you know I will put in a disclaimer. I have no financial interests in any of the places I have recommended. My recommendations were all based on my experiences with them. If you try them, I hope you have a similar experience.

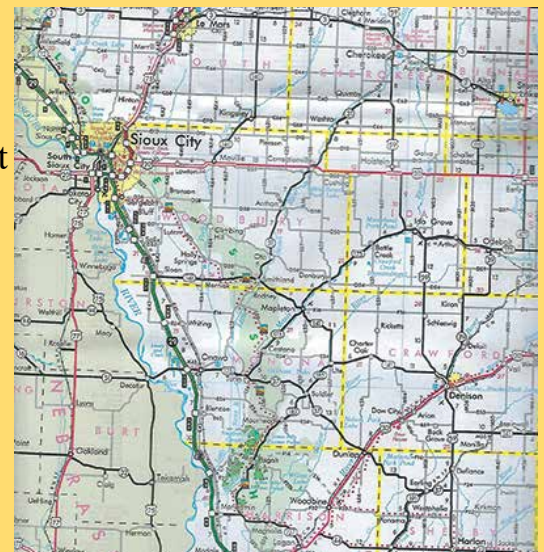
Thursday, June 10th: We had a consensus of tours.

Hornberga is a village in Orsa parish in Orsa municipality, Dalarna. Hornberga is located about 12 kilometers north of Orsa on the southern border of Orsa finnmark, which extends north of the village. The place is known, among other things, for its snake spruce population, discovered in 1907 & set aside as a nature reserve in 1908 & for the Hamregården camp site. Hamregården has functioned as a camp village since the late 1940s for well-behaved young people, mainly from Uppsala. The young people go to the farm on their school holidays & built, renovated & learned to take responsibility. The village was until 1877 a summer residence. In 1919 there were 16 farms in the village. Just northwest of the village rises Hornbergaberget. The hiking trail Siljansleden passes the northern part of the village. Here is also Hornberga chapel, which is decorated by Harry Sahlin and consecrated in 1962 by Bishop John Cullberg. Hornberga old school now serves as a community center. 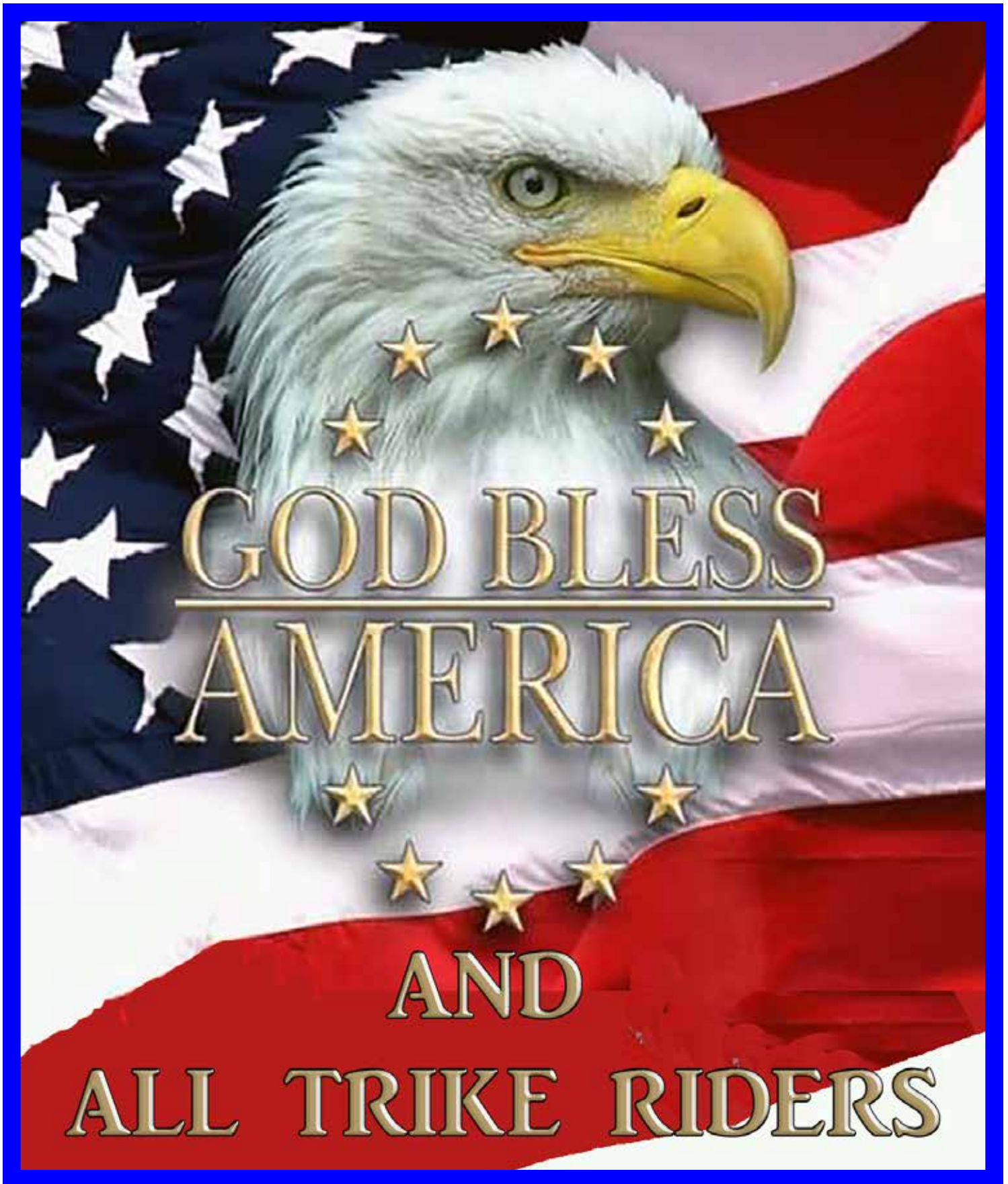
If it is your Region's turn to vote for your Director, have your Chapter or State Director contact HQ and get the documentation for the election.
