Tips for a Successful Chapter

Over the years I've met many chapter directors and seen many chapters start & grow, Some of our most successful chapter directors have come up with great ideas on keeping their chapters going and growing. I wanted to get some of these out to the members and other directors, as it might just make your job easier. These ideas may not work for everyone, but they just might work for some, as BTW continue to be a successful non-profit social organization of trikers. One of the most important things for a new director to know is the BTW Chapter By-laws. These can be found on our website at www.btw-trikers.org... Once you logged onto the website, click on the "information" tab found at the top of the page. another page will load, so then, scroll down until you see the line in blue that says, "By-Laws of BTW Chapters (Guidelines)". If you are not very computer savvy, you can try asking a chapter member to help you download them or you can also call your Regional Director for assistance & request a copy be mailed to you. Keeping lines of communication open is very important. We are trying to get all information that the members need to know put in the TRIKER magazine, but because the magazine comes out every other month, sometimes the information you read may be a little behind. This is the reason we really need for all Directors to maintain an email address and check it regularly. Also, this offers the members, and prospective new members, a quick, easy way to contact and/or communicate with the Director, and vice versa, without costly mailings or phone calls. Email is quick, easy to use, and there are many sites that offer free email accounts such as Google, Yahoo, and Gmail, just to name a few. If you do not know how to use email, or have an email account, again please contact your Regional Director and ask if they can put you in contact with somebody to help you. Along the lines of communication come chapter meetings. If you cook it, they will come. People love to eat. A great way to get members to attend meetings is to offer food. Directors are not expected to pay for or provide food, or a meal, however you should organize such events and perhaps ask the people attending the meeting to bring a dish and have a pot luck, or have the meeting at an inexpensive restaurant and perhaps try to arrange a special package price. Alternating the types of meetings is also a good idea, as not to get in a rut. One month meet at a restaurant, then the next month at a park for a picnic, or at somebody's house for the pot luck idea. When planning meetings keep you members in mind. Try to choose central locations so that you don't have one member driving a block while another member has to travel 40 miles one way to attend. Move your meetings around and keep them posted on your website. Also, plan meetings well in advance so that the members can plan to be there and make sure you have all their current email addresses in one file to make it easier for you to send out the notices. Your Meeting times can also be posted on the BTW website under the "Events" tab. But make sure all your members monitor this before relying on it. Remember to email a reminder about the meeting times and place just prior to the actual day, or if a meeting has to be canceled for any reason, be sure to notify everybody. Planning meetings well in advance with your members input, will also help to reduce conflicts in schedules. Also, try to have an agenda printed before the meeting. This is the responsibility of the Directors, but other offices can be assigned different tasks to take some of the burden off of one person. The Director is not expect to be able to do it all, but it is the Directors responsibility to co ordinate these jobs with the assistance from the officers and members. If you leave it up to others, or don't initiate activities, that is when things will start falling apart. No one person should have to plan, organize, schedule, contact, etc., all aspects of the chapters activities and/or meetings, but making sure that activities are beings planned and available is why we have and need Chapter Directors, Think of it as a team coach and without a coach the players can't function as a team.

Remember that we are a democracy and not a dictatorship. Votes should be taken on all issues and the majority should rule. When voting on major issues or for officers a notice should be sent out at least 30 days in advance so that every person in the chapter has plenty of time to plan to attend the meetings. (see BTW By-laws) If you have more members unable to attend than those that can for that date, reschedule the meeting. Each chapter should at least a Director and Secretary. The more active the chapter, the more officers you may need. If your chapter chooses to have chapter dues (which is optional) then you really should have a Treasurer & I suggest having a second person assist with chapter funds, one being the treasurer, and the other being a monitor to prevent any issues. Having and maintaining Chapter

Born to Be Wild, Aging Bikers Settle for Comfy

MOUNT AIRY, N.C. — In his nearly 50 years as an avid motorcyclist, Grady Howard has roared down the tobacco roads of North Carolina and through the mountains of old Kentucky, all with his wife, Barbara, tucked behind him. But with a balky left leg and myriad other maladies, he knew

the only way to stay wild was to add a wheel.

“I told my wife it was either trike it or park it,” said Mr. Howard, 74, wearing a cowboy hat and a bright yellow safety shirt. “And she said, ‘Trike it.’” Mr. Howard is one of a legion of aging bikers — suffering from aching joints and slowing reflexes — who have abandoned their traditional two-wheel motorcycles in favor of three-wheelers, the super-steady and seemingly safer machines commonly known as trikes. Equal parts “Easy Rider” and easy chair, the trikes have grown in popularity in recent years, expanding from a do-it-yourself niche to a potentially lucrative market for major manufacturers. Industry experts say the sale of tens of thousands of trikes, whose sticker prices can rival an upscale sedan’s — a new three-wheeled Harley starts at \$30,999 — has helped buoy a slumping industry and kept a generation of born-to-run riders on the roads. “The baby boomers are getting



older, man,” said Steve Stirewalt, a lifelong rider and motorcycle dealer known as Fat Daddy by his friends. “People riding all their lives don’t want to stop just because of bad knees, or bad eyes, or diabetes or something. They want to keep rocking.” Mr. Stirewalt, who is 63 and helped along by a hearing aid, was polishing his three-wheeler — a chrome-on-chrome chopper with a fake alligator skin seat — at the National East Coast Trike-In, which drew hundreds of trike owners and enthusiasts to Mount Airy, N.C., over Labor Day weekend.

Alex Ross, a.k.a. Iceman, chief executive of the nonprofit trike group Brothers of the Third Wheel, said three-wheelers offered all sorts of advantages, including the comfort and padding to allow drivers to go longer distances without stiffening up. “My wife goes to sleep as soon as we start traveling,” he said. With two bad knees, Mr. Ross, 71, switched to trikes about a decade ago but says he has seen the Brothers grow quickly in recent years, with about 250 new members, worldwide, every month. The group now counts chapters in 45 states, and not a feud among them. “We have a pact with all the gangs,” he said. “We don’t interfere with them, and they don’t interfere with us.”

That said, trikes have started to invade more traditional two-wheeled events, purring down highways from Laconia, N.H. — home to the longest-running bike rally in the country — to Ruidoso, N.M., site of this week’s Golden Aspen Motorcycle Rally, where organizers expect about a third of the bikes to be three-wheelers. “Our predominant crowd is 60 and over, and without a doubt, the trikes are taking over,” said Patric Pearson, owner of the Golden Aspen rally. Three-wheelers are even a common sight at Harley-happy events like the giant motorcycle rally in Sturgis,

S.D., that draws hundreds of thousands of people to the Black Hills every August, including Monte Hochhalter, a 68-year-old truck driver from Longmont, Colo., who decided to switch to three wheels after some pressure at home. “My equilibrium isn’t so good anymore,” Mr. Hochhalter said. “My wife wouldn’t ride with me.” Mr. Hochhalter was riding a converted 2006 Harley, which cost him \$18,000. But the company’s 2013 trike can go for almost twice that, complete with cruise control and a good set of high beams (perfect for older eyes, of course). It also comes with an ample trunk, something Tim Buche, the president of the Motorcycle Industry Council, a trade group, said was important to baby boomers — who make up a third of motorcycle owners. “Boomers travel,” he said. “And they like to take all their stuff.” A collection of independent companies has long offered kits to convert two-wheel bikes made by major manufacturers. But in 2008, Harley-Davidson — the industry leader in large touring bikes — announced that it would enter the market with the Tri Glide, working with a smaller company called Lehman Trikes. (In 2010, Harley moved production in-house.) The Tri Glide is now a consistent top-10 seller in several demographic groups, said Scott Habegger, the company’s director of product planning, including the company’s core customers: white men over 35. But the three-wheelers are tapping into another market: women, including those who may not have been comfortable handling a touring bike, which can weigh nearly 1,000 pounds, or were just tired of being relegated to the role of passenger.

A homemade bike at the Trike-In, which took place on Labor Day weekend and drew hundreds of owners and enthusiasts. “I don’t like riding behind him when I drive just as well,” said Melinda Metheney, 52, gesturing to her husband, Paul. She bought her new three-wheeler — a Canadian-built Can-Am Spyder, with two wheels in the front and one in the rear — in February. “I’ve never not beat a car or a motorcycle at a light,” she said. Chaz Rice, a spokesman for Bombardier Recreational Products, which makes the Can-Am brands, said it posted a 45 percent increase in North American sales in 2011, in part because Spyders were attracting first-time bikers who had never owned a motorcycle but always thought they would look good on one. “They are people who say, ‘I’ve always wanted to experience that motorcycle lifestyle but I never wanted to own a motorcycle,’” Mr. Rice said. Mr. Buche concurred, saying the trikes had made motorcycling more accessible, something the industry badly needed as sales fell more than 40 percent in 2009 as the recession took hold, and an additional 14 percent a year later.

“It’s a product that has broader appeal,” he said. “And that’s the very thing that can help us.” Part of that appeal has to do with the stability of three-wheelers, which don’t require riders to lean into curves or hold them steady at stoplights, both of which can challenge weak knees and muscles. That said, having three wheels can bring certain



social challenges. Advertisements for the Spyder, for example, feature the same kind of handsome graying men common to Viagra ads, and show a grizzled rider of a traditional two-wheeler nodding in approval of the three-wheeler. The reality at rallies, however, can be a little different. “I get ribbed once in a while, people saying I’m an old man,” said David Jenkins, 56, of Dobson, N.C., who bought his first trike — a sleek silver Suzuki — two months ago. “I always tell them, when they grow up they should get a real motorcycle, a three-wheeler.” For his part, Mr. Howard said he loved his ride — a 2010 Honda Goldwing converted by a company called Motor Trike. Barbara, his wife of 50 years, says she likes it, too, though she sounds a touch wistful about the couple’s old two-wheel

days. “You feel safer,” said Ms. Howard, 73, a retired schoolteacher. “But I liked the lean on the two-wheeler.” A retired veterans service officer, Mr. Howard — who wore loafers with Velcro fasteners — said he had already put 35,000 miles on his trike. And he plans to put on many, many more. “As long as I can throw a leg over it,” Mr. Howard said, “I’m going to keep going.”

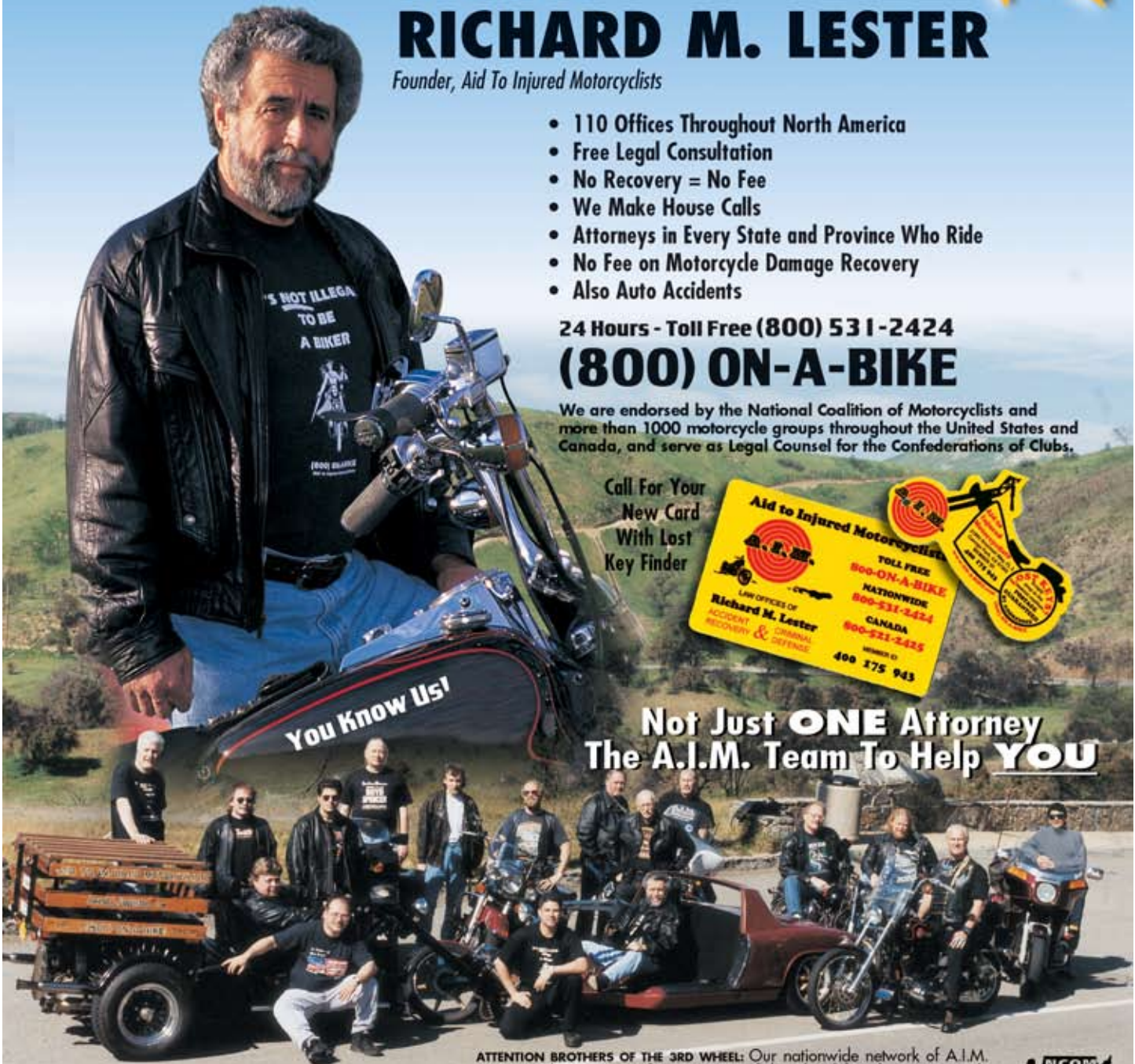

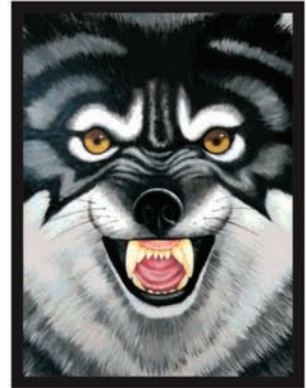

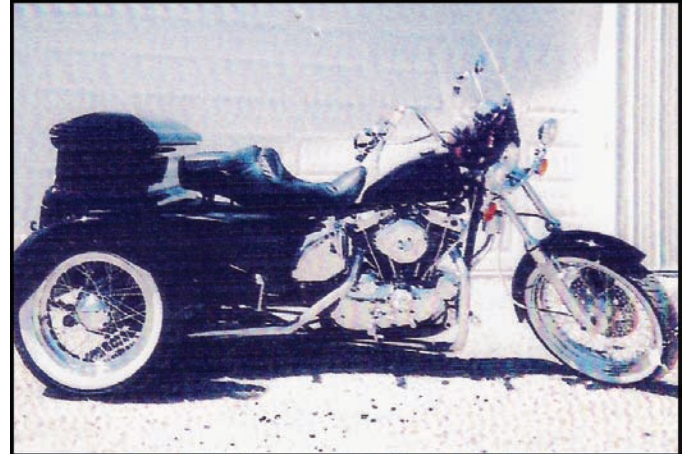

funds is the main contributor to dissension and controversy with a chapter, so making sure this issue is covered carefully from the beginning to prevent these type s of issues is very important. Take away the money and you take away most of the problems within a chapter.

Chapters should vote on whether or not they want to have dues or just collect required funds when needed for a specific item. Chapter dues will help to cover costs such as news-letters, and or activities. Which brings me to the next issue. BTW membership consists mostly of members reaching senior years. We need to involve the younger members to ensure the continuity of BTW. So when planning activities try to keep this in mind as we get older and less active, sitting around talking about riding is not the only thing to do. Try to plan meetings, or activities, that will spark the interest of younger members, and not too expensive, We know lots of you have many fund raising ideas and charity benefits that make it a worthwhile event and we would love to hear your ideas to be able to pass them along to others. Here are a few that might spark the interest of younger members, keep funds flowing, and not cost the chapter/members much.

1. Drag races - there are many places around that offer racing. The track assumes the risk as long as you have insurance. Have a motorcycle/trike race, or drag race. That will bring people. I know where I live there is a track and it brings in all kinds of people, of ALL ages, in all kinds of vehicles. I've seen a mom in a minivan race her 20 year old son on his homemade motorbike and Mom won. It was hilarious, yet it brought out the “family for fun together” we that we are always looking for. 1. If your chapter finds the track and promotes the event, you can charge to gain entrance to the event or ask the event center to donate money to the chapter if you bring the people.

2. Money in the Haystack - Host a party in the park in your community and get a couple rolls of quarters and ask for donations of 2 or 3 bigger prizes. The kids pay a couple bucks to search through the hay. You have a start and stop time and let' em go. Some will get money, and a few others prizes. Then you can have a booth with some dollar store items and allow the children to spend the money they found to buys little toys at your store. All the money goes back into the chapter. (take \$20 out of chapter money. \$20 goes into quarters, ask a farmer to donate hey, ask for donations of toys and prizes either from stores, second hand stores, and chapter members. Charge \$1 for the search per child. Some of the donated items get put on a table so the children can buy them after the hey search. If they didn't find enough money, mom, dad, or grandparents help them fill in the remaining \$1 or \$2. Price those items a little more than they are worth so at the end of the day, all the money put out for the event came back to the chapter plus whatever you may charge for the hey search. This was done in our community a year ago and that non-profit organization made \$50. I know that doesn't sound like much, but I live in a very small community. You must keep in mind community size, time of year, other activities going on throughout the community, and how big of an event to plan on something like this.)

These are just two ideas to bring money into you chapter, involve younger people, and to get non-members involved with and learn about our organization. You can also look to other chapters, larger chapters than yours, to see what they do. How did they get so many members? Do they have younger members? What do they do and how did they do it? Ask questions, get involved, send emails, make phone calls, get flyers out. BTW is and will be what you make of it and doesn't have to cost the director, or members, a bunch of money to do. A little can go a long way. Always keep in mind, headquarters is there to help you if you have questions. If they can't answer it, they will find somebody that can. Please don't get discouraged, if you don't get an answer, or a call returned immediately. It does take some time in some instances.

Please remember that raising money is not the main issue and very often, once you acquire funds, it can cause more dissension in a chapter than anything else. There are many chapters that operate without any bank account at all and just take up a collection for specific requirements as needed. The idea of BTW Chapters is to enjoy riding and the friendships made with other members. **DJ**

Excerpts from the Riverhead News Review in NY

‘Captain America’ is back, Arthur Rast turns heads with his homemade creation BY GIANNA VOLPE | STAFF WRITER



Arthur Rast III is better known to his friends as “Artie.” To most others he’s the unknown captain of a blue spaceship-like vehicle that can often be seen at the circle-side 7-Eleven in Riverhead during the summer months. Mr. Rast, who’s as friendly as they come and then some, happily talked with us this week about himself and his extraordinary creation, The Stealth, so we could find out more.

Q: Where did the idea for The Stealth come from?

A: When I had my kids, I got a side car because I wanted to be with them and when they outgrew those, I decided to build something bigger. In the ’70s, there were chopper-style Volkswagen and Harley three-wheelers, which don’t really perform, but look nice. I didn’t

want that; that’s old school. I wanted new school and new school doesn’t just happen, you make it happen. I ended up going with the style and shape of the Stealth fighter because when they first came out publicly in the Gulf War, they were America’s greatest — our homemade UFOs. That appealed to me.

Q: When and how did you make The Stealth?

A: I made it in six months, about 650 hours, in 1996 and 1997. I did it by myself because it’s hard to have helpers when you’re creating something entirely new. I started with a Fiat engine and when I got sick of that six years later, I just cut The Stealth in half, threw out the back and took another 350 hours to convert it to a Toyota MR2 automatic engine. It’s a four-cylinder, 1.6-liter twin-cam efficient engine. If you drove it, you’d probably get 40 miles to the gallon or better. I get 20 to 25 because I like to beat on it. The seat is the back seat from a ’91 LeBaron convertible. Anything I needed I got from two friends, one from a junkyard and the other who I got hundreds of dollars’ worth of metal from a van to work with. I didn’t have any money. I just wheeled and dealt to piece this together.



Q: How would you compare The Stealth to those Trihawks?

A: I don’t think there’s anything on the planet that can touch me on this. Every year, I go to one of those motorcycle fairs where the promoter rents out Riverhead Raceway and I sign a waiver to do some laps and about two years ago, my friend wanted to race me in a \$60,000 Canadian T-REX. I figured he’d blow me out of the water, but I wanted to race him, so we both signed the waiver. By the time I lapped him a second time, I felt so bad it was pathetic. A lot of people watching couldn’t believe some backyard machine was blowing a \$60,000 T-REX out of the water.

Q: What makes The Stealth so great?

A: I don’t know, I don’t understand why there’s all these bad-ass three-wheelers that, when I look at them, immediately show flaws in the physics of the four factors that make them handle: weight distribution, center of gravity, three contact points for stability and cambering the front wheel to make it turn with little effort. I don’t understand how a high school dropout better takes those four factors into consideration. It blows my mind.

Q: Why the Captain America theme?

A: At the shop I work at in Riverhead, I interact with this old Greek stitcher, Pete the Greek from the Hamptons. His son took him out of his retirement to keep him busy and we got to talking about how I think Captain America is a the best superhero because anybody that believes in the flag and the Constitution is Captain America, we just didn’t get that special juice. I contracted Pete to do a full cover for The Stealth and he custom-stitched a perfect cover in seven hours and with the rest of the day, he did a custom bra with Captain America’s shield on it and shrunk it down to fit The Stealth for free. People are always calling me Captain America and I say, “Hey, if you love the flag and the Constitution, you’re Captain America, too, and if you don’t, you’re not and you wouldn’t understand anyway.

Q: Do you remember the first time you were on a motorcycle?

A: I was 10 and I was the skinny, cute little cousin from Long Island that my cousins called “Nasty Rasty.” My cousin Albert put me on the front of a 250 BSA, a British bike, and let me do the throttle. Then he hopped off and I was on my own. It was the most scary and exciting thing that ever happened to me and I was hooked. Motorcycles became a way of life for me, like an addiction, and with that came the injuries, the good times and bad times.

Q: Tell me about your progression in motorcycles.

A: After my father passed away, my mother got me a go-kart that I made into a mini-bike. Because I didn’t have a father, the money wasn’t there, so I ended up learning how everything I had worked and how to fix them out of necessity. I needed to drop out early from school to help my mother because things were tough, so I ended up at a gas station because I knew something about mini-bikes and I could get myself in there. My son and daughter are my success. You can build skyscrapers and invent cures, but if you raise one good kid, you did something good with your life. I’m double blessed because I’ve got two that are nothing like the way I was growing up in the streets.
