FROM THE WEB

REBUILD OF A 1982 TRIDENT BY BTW MEMBER NOEL MOSS

This message thread is for documenting the rebuild of the 1982 Trident CX500-based police trike that I acquired this past spring. The first several postings below cover work during the past week.



THE TRIKE AS ACQUIRED

The first order of business is to get the engine running. The fuel system is a horror show - the tank is filled with stuff that belongs at an EPA toxic waste site. Really ugly. I am 100% confident that the carbs are a horror show as well. I had contacted Howard Halasz (a Randakk recommended carb guru for CX500 carbs) and he basically declined the carb work. If I don't find someone else to do the carbs I will take a shot at them myself although I prefer they be done by a carb guru.

First thing I did was to verify that the engine wasn't seized. I removed the spark plugs and the crankshaft access cover and was easily able to manually turn the engine over via the crankshaft bolt. The rubber boot on the right-side spark plug was dry rotted (most of the rubber pieces are dry rotted) to the point where water had accumulated in the spark plug recess. There is a boatload of corrosion in the recess. I blew out the accumulated crud and sprayed Kroil in there. After letting it sit awhile I was able to fairly easily remove the spark plug. There were a couple of small spots at the very top of the spark plug thread where there was a minute bit of aluminum from the head but close inspection showed the threads in the head looked pretty good. I was able to screw a new spark plug into the hole without any issues. The left side plug came out with no issues.

The work plan is as follows:

- 1) Clean the fuel system and rebuild the carbs.
- 2) Replace the throttle tube. The one that came on the trike literally crumbled.
- 3) Go through the electrical system sufficiently to get the starter and ignition working.
- 4) Change the coolant. Fix whatever leaks.
- 5) Change the air filter, oil and oil filter
- 6) Get the beast to fire up.

Once I get the engine running I will do several oil and filter changes followed by a cooling system flush and replacement of the coolant hoses.

7) Rebuild the brakes.

8) Go through the rest of the electrical system. This thing has a car battery rather than a bike battery. See the next post.

Stay tuned.

NOEL HAS OFFERED SOME HISTORY OF THIS TRIKE FOR US

The trike is a Trident police trike. It was built by a company named Municipal Industries which was located in Chicago and is no longer in business. Information I have found indicates that they built about 280 of these trikes for various police departments as well as private owners. A dealer named Regency in Chicago sold them as the MC-1 three-wheel motorcycle. Trident police trikes are not Harley Davidsons. They are based on the 1982 Honda CX500 motorcycle. The CX500 was Honda's first V-twin bike and it is a transverse V-twin, similar to a Motoguzzi. The engine is 500cc and has an early version of an electronic ignition. There are no points but by the same token, it is NOT a magneto ignition either. CX500s are water cooled and have shaft drive. MCI's modifications to the frame made it into a hardtail so the rear "suspension" is really a pair of small coilovers under the seat to cushion the rider's butt. The rear-end is from an early-70s Jeep CJ-5 and it uses Bendix brakes in the rear.

My particular trike was originally used by the St. Louis, Missouri Police Department. I acquired the trike from Howard "Crash" Telthorst, the Gateway chapter director in St. Louis. He had originally purchased the trike for his wife, Gay, but she apparently wasn't interested in riding it so it sat in his driveway for about 10 years before he sold it to me. I have reason to believe it's a "metermaid" trike due to its low gearing. It's geared so low that it's possible to start out in 2nd or 3rd gear with almost no clutch slip. At 45 - 50 MPH in 5th gear the engine is doing about 5500 RPM. At some time in the future I will see if it's possible to install taller gears in the rear-end to bring down the engine RPMs at speed. I have attached some additional images that may be of interest for the article.

ELIO HAS JUST \$4,444 IN THE BANK WHICH DELAYS PRODUCTION AGAIN UNTIL LATE 2019



Things aren't looking too good....

Surprise, surprise. The trail of broken promises that is Elio has once again decided to delay production. In a recent Securities and Exchange Commission filing, Elio has stated that production is not expected to begin until the fourth quarter of 2019 [1]. Come on, really, Elio? What kind of nonsense is this? Do you mean to tell us that it takes EIGHT YEARS to put a motorized tricycle into production? I mean, they raised MILLIONS of dollars through crowdfunding and other forms of investment [2], yet they have accumulated over \$145 MILLION [3] in debt without a single customer car being built.

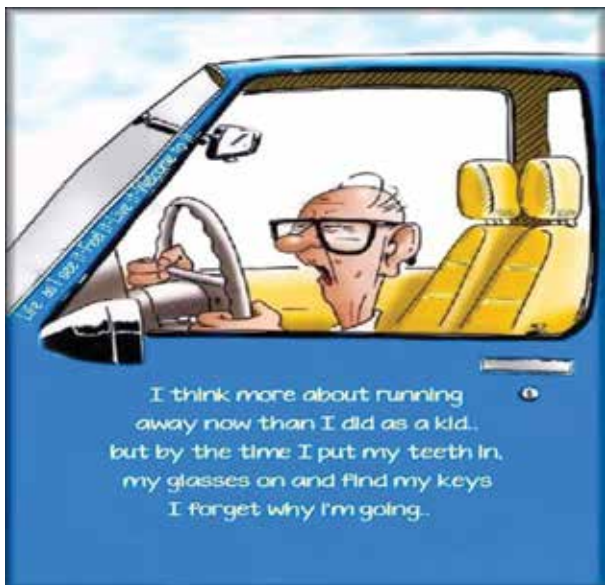

“Tree Of Life”

There were a lot of cool places I could “hang out” on our 365 acre farm growing up. We had two springs, a 3 acre pond and a swamp back in the big woods. There was a stream that ran through the whole property and at least 5 wooded lots with different trees, vegetation and wildlife. It was a mecca of beauty, solitude and solace. There was, however one secluded spot that made me feel like I was on top of the world, master of my domain and king of my own little realm.

When we moved to Union County, Ohio in 1957 I was devastated, I had left the only home and friends I had ever known for a region that I was unfamiliar with. I always felt at home in the out doors and especially in the woods, so I imagine that is why I sought a safe haven up along the wooded creek bank across the road. There was an old Oak tree that was about 3 foot in diameter when I first discovered it at 8 years old. I was totally unaware of how old it was but I didn’t care. It had room to sit between it and the steep bank that dropped well over 20 feet down to “Buck Run Creek” and it sustained much life within it’s system. Squirrels had many nests in the tall limbs that rose above the creek bank. Raccoon’s were housed in a couple of the bigger branches that were hollow from lightening strikes killing the limbs. Different species of birds nested in the foliage of the limbs in the spring. The roots were mined with Ground Hog holes and loose dirt piled over the edge. At some time a previous landowner had built a lean-to and attached it to the old tree but time had all but destroyed it, leaving 2 steel posts that gave the structure it’s strength. For years I rode my horse by the tree 2 times daily, herding the Holsteins to our barn for milking. The cattle wore a deep, wide path down the bank and crossed the creek at the shallows.

From that vantage point you could see my parents house, 600 yards across the creek and the valley of rich topsoil. West of my parents house was a little road where you could observe people coming to a screeching halt, they didn’t remember the stop sign until they crested the hill. On the same side of the road, another 250 yards was “Buck Run Cemetery” where the newest grave marker dated back to 1947. Just beyond that was “Buck Run Bridge”, where once stood an old covered bridge which had many of it’s own memories through time. Looking east you could see the farm houses for miles, heading into town. It was from under that tree I sat and hunted, camped as a child and as an adult with my own children. After hot summer days of baling hay or shoveling dusty grain into bins, I would take a much needed dip in the cool stream, guarded by the shade from that tree. I sat there many times and thought about my future plans and the war in southeast Asia. I built my house not far from the old tree. My sons and I watched many deer, fox, coyote and other wild animals drink from the waters flowing under the tree. It was a majestic place to relax, ponder thoughts and reflect back on some sad events in my life.

I shall never forget the crisp, still, cold January morning I sat quietly with a muzzle loader hunting Deer. I heard the emergency squad sirens blaring as they came from the Allen Center Station, 2 mile away. I watched them turn the corner and stop in front of my Mom and Dad’s house. I hustled over in time to watch the EMT’s load mother into the ambulance for her last trip to town from a fatal stroke. I remember the warm November afternoon when I shot the prettiest buck I had ever seen on that land only to loose his trail, finding him 3 days later, mangled and ripped from coyote and other predators. The auto accident I witnessed as a ‘57 Chevy couldn’t get stopped and rolled across the road killing one person and injuring 3 other family members. At times I would take a break from field work for a cool drink from my thermos under the tree. There I observed my friends riding their BSA, Triumph, Norton, Honda and Harley Motorcycles up and down St. Rt. 245. I longed to be riding with them but the work had to be done. Back then I would see an occasional Trike and wondered how it rode and drove. I wept under that tree as I readied for my move from the house I built and living 50 years on that property. My health kept me from living there,

I could no longer care for all the acreage, water ways or keep up with taxes and insurance. My best years were behind me, as were the tree's. My old steel chair remains for my frequent visits. I still observe Motorcycles and many Trikes traveling on St. Rt. 245.

The most saddening delima is for the tree itself. Erosion from all the freezing and thawing, high water from the creek and rains washing down the old cow paths has caused the earth to fade away. The grand old tree has subsided down the bank by over 3 feet. The roots are all out of the ground and mostly dead. The limbs are dying and falling off, lack of nutrients and water have taken a toll. Lightening has hit it many times and there are no animals inhabiting its structure. The strong old Oak is at it's end and will soon fall into the stream that was once it's life's blood. My son will then saw it up for firewood to assist with his winter heat.

It takes a lifetime to grow a tree. That tree is as much a part of me as my family. It was my friend and confidant. Man also grows old and weather's through each passing season. We feel our weak and eroded systems breaking down and slowly decaying from with-in. We leave our family and friends and become a memory in time. As the old Oak has sprouted many new saplings we too leave sons and daughters to carry on our legacy and family name. The tree of life will always sustain, in one way or another and so will we. **Geno BTW**

CHECK 5 BEFORE YOU RIDE

1: Tires, check your tires to make sure they are properly inflated. Every rider should know the proper PSI rating for their tires. Checking them when they are cold is best. Check them for any wear, anything embedded, broken or damaged spokes and rims, and make sure the tread is adequate.

2: Lights, Make sure all lights are in good working order. Head lights (High and Low Beam), Brake lights and Turn Signals. Check that the covers are not loose or cracked, are free of dirt and bugs, and that the bulbs are bright enough to be seen. (Always carry extra fuses.)

3: Controls. Make sure your cables are in good condition, not worn or frayed, no kinks or bends, and are securely connected. Check your clutch and brake levers, make sure they are not loose, that they pull easily and return to their proper position. Look at your brake and shifter, make sure they are attached securely, not bent, and in proper working order. Double Check Your Brakes.

4: Fluids. Check your fluids, make sure your oil level is sufficient. Improper oil level could damage your bike. Everyone should know their bikes correct oil weight, and how to check and fill it properly. Check your gas, you may have used more or forgotten to fill up after your last ride. Your boots are not made for walking.

5: Kickstand. Check that it is properly attached, not loose, wobbly or bent. You don't want to be riding down the road, look in your mirror, and see your kickstand bouncing down the road behind you.

The goal is to enjoy the ride and arrive safely.

AMCN Membership Terms and Conditions

AirMedCare Network is an alliance of affiliated air ambulance providers* (each a "Company"). An AirMedCare Network membership automatically enrolls you as a member in each Company's membership program. Membership ensures the patient will have no out-of-pocket flight expenses if flown by a Company by providing prepaid protection against a Company's air ambulance costs that are not covered by a member's insurance or other benefits or third party responsibility, subject to the following terms and conditions:

- Patient transport will be to the closest appropriate medical facility for medical conditions that are deemed by AMCN Provider attending medical professionals to be life- or limb-threatening, or that could lead to permanent disability, and which require emergency air ambulance transport. A patient's medical condition, not membership status, will dictate whether or not air transportation is appropriate and required. Under all circumstances, an AMCN Provider retains the sole right and responsibility to determine whether or not a patient is flown.
- AMCN Provider air ambulance services may not be available when requested due to factors beyond its control, such as use of the appropriate aircraft by another patient or other circumstances governed by operational requirements or restrictions including, but not limited to, equipment manufacturer limitations,

governmental regulations, maintenance requirements, patient condition, age or size, or weather conditions. FAA restrictions prohibit most AMCN Provider aircraft from flying in inclement weather conditions. The primary determinant of whether to accept a flight is always the safety of the patient and medical flight crews. Emergent ground ambulance transport of a member by an AMCN Provider will be covered under the same terms and conditions.

- Members who have insurance or other benefits, or third party responsibility claims, that cover the cost of ambulance services are financially liable for the cost of AMCN Provider services up to the limit of any such available coverage. In return for payment of the membership fee, the AMCN Provider will consider its air ambulance costs that are not covered by any insurance, benefits or third party responsibility available to the member to have been fully prepaid. The AMCN Provider reserves the right to bill directly any appropriate insurance, benefits provider or third party for services rendered, and members authorize their insurers, benefits providers and responsible third parties to pay any covered amounts directly to the AMCN Provider. Members agree to remit to the AMCN Provider any payment received from insurance or benefit providers or any third party for air medical services provided by the AMCN Provider, not to exceed regular charges. Neither the Company nor AirMedCare

Network is an insurance company. Membership is not an insurance policy and cannot be considered as a secondary insurance coverage or a supplement to any insurance coverage. Neither the Company nor AirMedCare Network will be responsible for payment for services provided by another ambulance service.

- Membership starts 15 days after the Company receives a complete application with full payment; however, the waiting period will be waived for unforeseen events occurring during such time. Members must be natural persons. Memberships are non-refundable and non-transferable.
- Some state laws prohibit Medicaid beneficiaries from being offered membership or being accepted into membership programs. By applying, members certify to the Company that they are not Medicaid beneficiaries.
- These terms and conditions supersede all previous terms and conditions between a member and the Company or AirMedCare Network, including any other writings, or verbal representations, relating to the terms and conditions of membership.

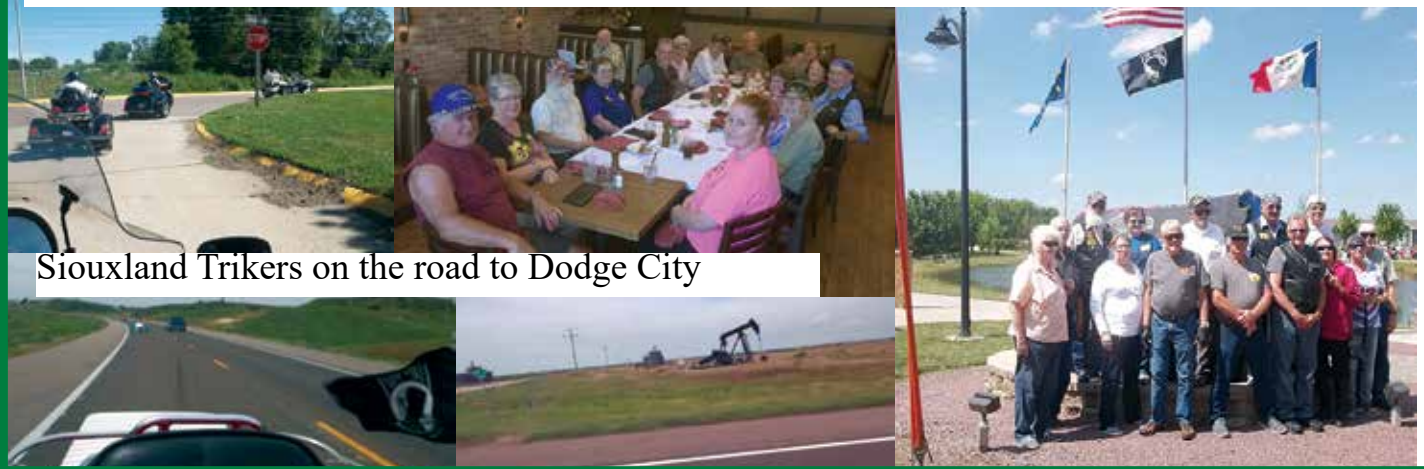

TRAILER LIGHTING REQUIREMENTS



When you're out on the road pulling your trailer, you want to be as safe as possible. One important component of towing safety is visibility - making sure other drivers can see your trailer. And lighting plays a big role in visibility. So, whether you're replacing a single light bulb or lens cover, or you're adding a complete set of lights to a homemade trailer, you want to get the right part for the job.

You also want to get lights that comply with the US government's lighting requirements for trailers. Based on standards developed by the Society of Automotive Engineers (SAE), the National Highway and Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) has developed requirements for vehicle lights.

The set of regulations that applies to vehicle lighting is known as FMVSS 108, and it includes lighting requirements for trailers. These regulations define how many lights a trailer must have, where the lights should be located, what performance standards the lights must meet, and how manufacturers must label lighting components.

Note: The information contained in this article is based on the US government's regulations pertaining to vehicle trailer lighting. These regulations can be found under Title 49, Part 571, Section 108 of the Code of Federal Regulations. This section covers lamps, reflective devices, and associated equipment related to motor vehicles. 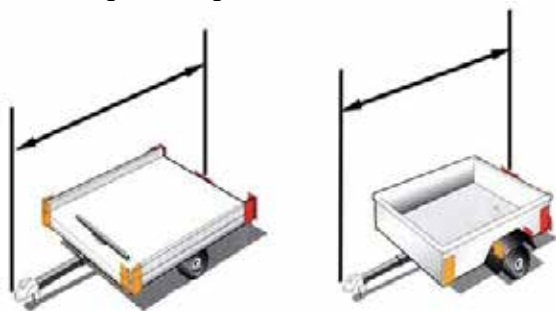

Determine Which Lights Your Trailer Needs

All trailers are required to have [stop lights](#), [tail lights](#), [turn signals](#), and [reflectors](#). Trailers that are 80" wide or wider, or that are 30' long or longer need additional lights and reflectors. A trailer that is 80" wide or wider and has a Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (GVWR) over 10,000 lbs requires [conspicuity treatments](#). These treatments consist of strips of reflective tape or rows of individual reflectors that create an alternating pattern of red and white along the sides and rear of a trailer to make it easier to see.

To determine which lights a trailer needs, you need to know the trailer's overall length and width and whether the trailer's GVWR is greater than 10,000 lbs. If you don't know the dimensions of your trailer, you'll have to measure it. To find your trailer's GVWR, look for a sticker located somewhere on the trailer.

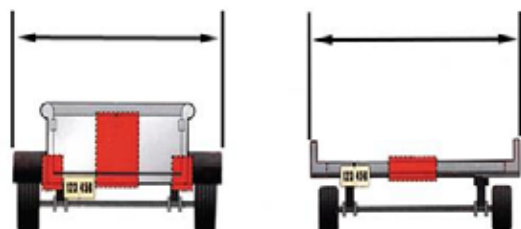
Measuring the Length of a Trailer



To find a trailer's length, measure from the rearmost point on your trailer to the point of the trailer closest to the vehicle. Be sure to include the coupler or any overhang in this measurement.

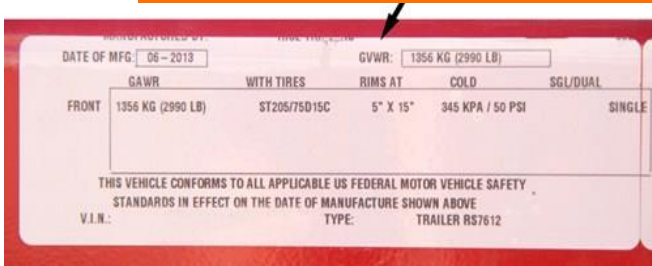
Measuring the Width of a Trailer

To find the width, measure at the trailer's widest point. This measurement must include any overhang or protruding fenders.

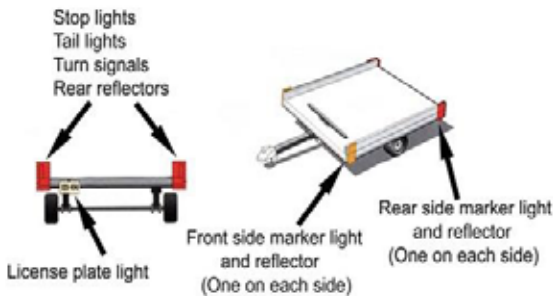


To find a trailer's GVWR look on the trailer's tongue or frame for a plate; you will find the GVWR there.

Once you know your trailer's length, width, and GVWR, you can use the following list to find the specific lights for your trailer.

- Trailer is less than 80" wide and less than 30' long
- Trailer is 80" or wider, less than 30' long, and has a GVWR of 10,000 lbs or less
- Trailer is 80" or wider, 30' or longer, and has a GVWR greater than 10,000 lbs
- Trailer is 30' or longer (regardless of width or GVWR)

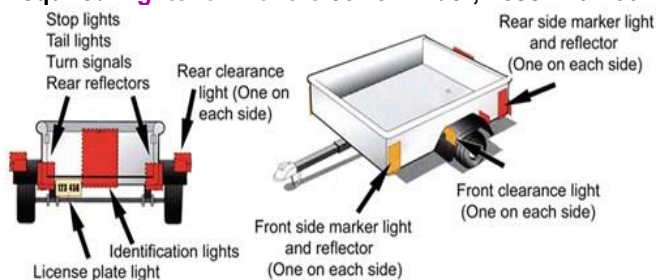

Exceptions

- If your trailer is less than 6' long, you do not need to have front side marker lights or front side marker reflectors.
- If your trailer is less than 30" wide, you only need to have 1 brake light, 1 tail light, and 1 rear reflector. These lights should be mounted at the center of the trailer, rather than on an outer edge.

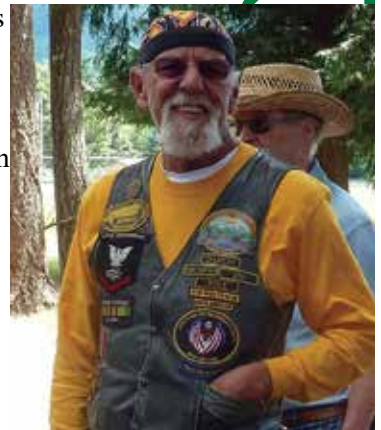

In Memory of Trikers Lost



We have lost a dear friend, and pillar of the Coastal Cruisers Chapter of the BTW. James F. Churchward known by all as "Churchy", passed away unexpectedly in his home on June 28th, 2017 at age 73. Churchy, native of Tacoma, attended Wilson High School and graduated Class of 1961 where he went on to serve three years in the United States Navy (1961-1964). He had a 16-year career at C&G Electronics Co. and continued his education at Tacoma Community College which later led him to starting up his own business. Starting in 1977 Churchy began his most infamous project, The Trike. Shown at various car and motorcycle shows through 1979 where it received praise and several top awards. In 2006, after 27 years in storage, he began the restoration of his trike, which included transforming the trike into a two-seater so Linda could accompany him. Churchy's passion led him to becoming a member of Brothers of the Third Wheel in 2007 and State Director of BTW in 2015. He also served several years as Road Captain for the Coastal Cruisers. He was the major influence in the forming of three new BTW chapters in Washington state.



He also served as a professional Santa for 15 years before he retired, starting with the American Heart Association of Washington and ending with The Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation. He put smiles on the faces of many children. Churchy is survived by his wife, "he would say the best thing that ever happened to him", Linda Churchward, 3 children: Lisa (Loy), John (Corie), and Jason (Lorraine), 11 grandchildren, and 9 great grandchildren. He is also survived by two brothers, CW Churchward of Gulf Breeze, FL, Budd Churchward of Birch Bay, WA, and one sister, Maggie Law of San Juan Island, WA. Churchy will be forever loved by his extensive extended family, friends, and neighbors. Churchy was known for his kindness, love for family, jack of all trade skills, and willingness to lend a helping hand.

Words do no justice to the "pebble in the pond" legacy he has left for us all.

On July 22 while on a toy run ride with fellow BTW riders of the BC chapter, dear brother Kris Klassen, flying our flag, was suddenly called to the great ride in the sky. He heroically steered his mighty V-8 powered trike out of danger to all others as his last act in our world. Prior to that, he was chauffeuring Santa on the morning section of the toy run. At lunch, he remarked that "this is the best ride ever". Amongst the trophies that day was that for "Longest Distance Travelled". Ironically, he rode all the way to the Pearly Gates. When Kris departed this world, he was literally doing what he loved; surrounded with family members; surrounded with friends. Not many of us go out in such style. Kris was always keen to share his knowledge and love of trikes. For those who met him, he was instantly one's Best Friend Forever. That's no exaggeration. Yes, Kris will be missed by us all. Deeply and Sincerely. It comforts us to know that he is now riding with the angels and preparing a place for us all. Our heartfelt condolences and blessings go to Kris's family and dear friends. BTW BOD Elections

BTW is split into 10 Regions; 9 of these regions are in the USA and Canada and the final one covers all areas outside of the USA & Canada. Each Region has a Regional Director.
