AMCN Membership Terms and Conditions

AirMedCare Network is an alliance of affiliated air ambulance providers* (each a "Company"). An AirMedCare Network membership automatically enrolls you as a member in each Company's membership program. Membership ensures the patient will have no out-of-pocket flight expenses if flown by a Company by providing prepaid protection against a Company's air ambulance costs that are not covered by a member's insurance or other benefits or third party responsibility, subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. Patient transport will be to the closest appropriate medical facility for medical conditions that are deemed by AMCN Provider attending medical professionals to be life- or limb-threatening, or that could lead to permanent disability, and which require emergency air ambulance transport. A patient's medical condition, not membership status, will dictate whether or not air transportation is appropriate and required. Under all circumstances, an AMCN Provider retains the sole right and responsibility to determine whether or not a patient is flown.
2. AMCN Provider air ambulance services may not be available when requested due to factors beyond its control, such as use of the appropriate aircraft by another patient or other circumstances governed by operational requirements or restrictions including, but not limited to, equipment manufacturer limitations, governmental

regulations, maintenance requirements, patient condition, age or size, or weather conditions. FAA restrictions prohibit most AMCN Provider aircraft from flying in inclement weather conditions. The primary determinant of whether to accept a flight is always the safety of the patient and medical flight crews. Emergent ground ambulance transport of a member by an AMCN Provider will be covered under the same terms and conditions.

3. Members who have insurance or other benefits, or third party responsibility claims, that cover the cost of ambulance services are financially liable for the cost of AMCN Provider services up to the limit of any such available coverage. In return for payment of the membership fee, the AMCN Provider will consider its air ambulance costs that are not covered by any insurance, benefits or third party responsibility available to the member to have been fully prepaid. The AMCN Provider reserves the right to bill directly any appropriate insurance, benefits provider or third party for services rendered, and members authorize their insurers, benefits providers and responsible third parties to pay any covered amounts directly to the AMCN Provider. Members agree to remit to the AMCN Provider any payment received from insurance or benefit providers or any third party for air medical services provided by the AMCN Provider, not to exceed regular charges. Neither the Company nor AirMedCare

Network is an insurance company. Membership is not an insurance policy and cannot be considered as a secondary insurance coverage or a supplement to any insurance coverage. **Neither the Company nor AirMedCare Network will be responsible for payment for services provided by another ambulance service.**

4. Membership starts 15 days after the Company receives a complete application with full payment; however, the waiting period will be waived for unforeseen events occurring during such time. Members must be natural persons. Memberships are non-refundable and non-transferable.
 5. Some state laws prohibit Medicaid beneficiaries from being offered membership or being accepted into membership programs. By applying, members certify to the Company that they are not Medicaid beneficiaries.
 6. These terms and conditions supersede all previous terms and conditions between a member and the Company or AirMedCare Network, including any other writings, or verbal representations, relating to the terms and conditions of membership.
- *Air Evac EMS, Inc. / Guardian Flight, LLC / Med-Trans Corporation / REACH Air Medical Services, LLC -- These terms and conditions apply to all AirMedCare Network participating provider membership programs, regardless of which participating provider transports you.

Angels On The Road

Outside of Winslow, we turned onto Highway 40. As I merged onto the highway, I had a problem shifting into 4th gear. The more I worked at it, the more anxious and frustrated I became. The shift lever is below my right hip, which is not convenient in any sense of the word. I don't know what made me look in my mirror. When I did, there must have been a small voice in my ear. When I looked up, all I could see in my mirror was a SILVER GRILL and the letters MACK! A semi was just about to climb up my luggage rack! Heart in my throat, hands frozen on the handlebars, I didn't react, but time seemed to be in slow motion! I caught a glimpse of Lee up ahead, on the side of the road. I couldn't hear what he was yelling, but the pure terror on his face must have mirrored my own! Suddenly I was parked on the shoulder with the roar of semis' flying by. How I got there, I have no idea! I didn't remember turning off the road. I sat in shock till Lee rode back. We just sat there looking at one another. I know he was thinking, "She is going to be too scared to ride!" After a bit he asked if I was ok and ready to go on. "DO I have a choice?" I thought. It was here, that I began to suspect, that Lee and I were not alone on this trip.

Farther down the road I started thinking that if that semi had pulled out to pass, the one on his tail would have hit me! There were five semis' in a row. Anyone of them could have wiped me out! Talk about a sobering thought! Added to that I still couldn't remember getting myself out of the way of those semis and stopping on the side of the road! What had happened? How did I get there? It was near the end of our trip before I figured it out... Every mile of the trip the angels were with us.

We had put some miles behind us, and we were approaching Chambers, when a little birdie said, "Are you missing something?" Then, I realized I didn't have my glasses on. If I hadn't had that near miss with the semi, I would probably have noticed earlier. I remembered taking them off, and setting them on the bike rack while we were working on the radios. Putting on, and taking off, the helmet is easier without glasses. So now, I figured, they were a permanent part of the Circle K parking lot. Plus, Winslow was a long way behind us. I hadn't brought a spare set. This caused a major problem! There is a little box on my license that says I need glasses to drive. So on top of NOT having a motorcycle license, I didn't have glasses either! Then, there was the small problem of needing photo grey lenses, because of bright light.

Reaching Chambers, I turned into a mall and found a pharmacy. I searched the rack for a pair of generic glasses that would hold me over till I could get an extra pair from home. It took several pairs, before I found one that didn't make me nauseated. A couple miles under the bright sun I realized with no photo greys and a stigmatism these glasses wouldn't work for long. At the next stop, I purchased sunglasses. They would do ok until I reached Colorado Springs. I prayed we wouldn't get stopped. No license! No insurance! No glasses! I can

see the State Trooper, with that permanent frown on his face, opening his book of tickets, and proceeding to write out a very expensive lesson. I can see myself calling home for bail money and for one of my sons to come get me with a truck and trailer. Boy that would go over well!

We headed back out on the interstate for Gallop, New Mexico, which was about a hundred miles. We crossed the border at Lupton, Arizona and Manuelito, New Mexico. The Navajo Indian Reservation north of highway 40, on both the Arizona - New Mexico side, is home to the Hopi Indians. If there had been more Time, I would like to have stayed there a couple days.

Highway 40 to Gallop, was straight and the sun high in the clear sky. I don't think there had been clouds since we left. As we topped a hill, what is known as a "hill" in New Mexico, we could see the road go into the horizon as far as we could see. It looked like a long, black, glistening, ribbon, weaving its way into the horizon. Due to the heat, the road looked as if it were quivering in the sun.

We stopped on the side of the road, for a break, when I noticed a long dirt road with light poles running the length of it. The road seemed to stretch into nowhere. Lee said the poles were for electricity, for the ranch. How far is the ranch? I asked. Could be 20-30 miles, or more, he said. I hadn't seen such skinny light poles since I was a kid, back in farm country, in northern, Wisconsin. How did they stand in the wind and sand storms? Out in the middle of nowhere? With no wind break? How often are they out of power? I wondered.

To see any form of life in this area, away from a town, was rare. SO, I was surprised, and excited, to see an Indian woman on horseback, herding sheep. I watched her for as long as I could. I would have loved to talk with her. Spend a little time getting to know her. She sat easy in the saddle as the horse went about its work. If I had been traveling with a woman, we would have stopped for sure. BUT, then we would have been a long way off schedule.

The Navajo Reservation sat out on the wind swept desert floor. Their homes were wood structures. No color. No trees. No shade. NO AIR CONDITIONING! Nothing moved in the heat, except two people on trikes heading down the road. I caught a glimpse of a hogan set back and a short distance from the main houses. It's the first time I had seen one and I wondered if the Navajo still had gatherings and ceremony there? It seemed old and lonely setting separate from the homes, but here was a sense of dignity, power, of purpose, if not now, then in the past.

Lee could live in the desert. He had been in Arizona for years. Whereas, I had trouble with 90 degrees, in the shade. As long as the trike kept rolling I was good. I admire and respect anyone who can live in this heat. People from the southwest say "but our heat is dry, not humid" Well, BIG DEAL! Heat is heat!

A few miles further down the road, there appeared in the distance a huddle of reddish brown, clay adobe style buildings. They looked as if they were stacked one on top of the other. Three stories high, stretched out long and narrow. The area around the building was miles of desert floor with not a bush, boulder, ditch or tree anywhere. Nor was there a person in sight. There was an aura about the place that made me uncomfortable. It was so.....desolate! Later, I

asked Lee what the buildings were. He said it was a prison. When you go to prison here, there are no comforts. No air conditioning and no special food. No wonder I didn't see anyone in this heat. There were guards, Lee said, but no one was stupid enough to try anything, since the guards shoot to kill. Desolate, despair, depressing. So unlike prisons, as we know them. Sixteen years later, the hopelessness of that prison still haunts me.

Rolling into Gallop, all I could think of was, "I am on route 66!" What a rush!" Remember the old show Route 66? Here I am, on the same road! I was looking forward to a hot shower, a hot meal, and an early night. Being out in the hot sun and riding all day, really made me tired. There weren't any campgrounds nearby, so it would be another night in a motel. We checked into the Shallman. I wasn't impressed, but there really wasn't anything better to choose from. The clerk was not overly friendly, and the place needed cleaning. I tried being friendly, because I know people on trikes are always suspect. But, my patience doesn't run long with unfriendly people. I make the first move to be friendly and then it's up to them. Once I had a long, hot shower, and put on some clean jeans and shirt, we headed downtown to find a restaurant. I had looked forward to seeing Gallop. It was a town legends are made of. Louie L'Amour wrote many westerns and Gallop was always one of the leading towns in New Mexico. Being the biggest town in that area of New Mexico, it was also on the trail into Arizona. A logical place for everyone's path to cross, supplies picked up, information gathered and mail to send or pick up. Probably the nearest law for miles around. As we road down the street, I realized the purpose for Gallop, was probably still the same as the 1800's. I don't know what I expected, maybe a more romantic place, a place more like what L'Amour wrote about? What I was seeing was an unfriendly town. People looked sideways at us, or ignored us. No one smiled or was curious. If they were they hid it well. We passed the local deputy, and he just stared a hole through us. I felt like we were being watched, it made me weary of my surroundings. I was anxious to get back to the motel. The next morning my shifting lever had been fooled with. We checked the trikes over carefully before we took off. Again I felt as if someone was watching! On our way out of town we stopped at a couple shops. The H. Dorado Gallery had authentic Kachina dolls, turquoise jewelry, and ceremonial pipes made from red clay. I bought a silver and turquoise ring just to say I had bought it on Route 66 in Gallop, New Mexico! The next shop we went into had "Authentic Indian Jewelry" and was run by an "Eastern India" Indian. She couldn't tell a bear fetish from a wolf. We went outside and laughed till we drew attention. It was time to get out of Dodge. Oh, I mean Gallop!

Chapter 4

We followed Route 66 passing little frontier towns like Yah-Tah-Hey, Coyote Canyon, Tohatchi, Naschutti, and Sheep Springs. The Chuska Mountains Range was on the left, and the Navajo Reservation on the right. I missed so much, because we were riding through, and stopping only long enough to fuel and get something to eat. When I would suggest we stop somewhere for a day, or two, Lee always reminded me..... we had a dead line! The deadline,

being a family reunion in Iowa. I thought, I would remember everything I saw, but there was so much to see and wonder about. I wondered about the origin of names such as Tohatchi and Yah-Tah-Hey. Were they the names of Indian leaders? Who settled here and why? I missed so much, like the Chuska Mountains, because I hadn't looked at the map. I had no idea it was even a mountain range. I let Lee do the navigating. I was happy to just ride. Now, as I am writing this story, and retracing our route I realized how much I missed. If I had known about Mesa Verde, I wouldn't have passed it by, causing me to miss the Anasazi cliff dwellings. Will I ever get the chance to do that again?

We reached Shiprock, and pulled into a Stop-N-Go. It was nothing fancy, just a little dusty, oasis for gas, pop, and a restroom. Pop machine was broken. The word oasis congers up a haven of green palms, cool, clear, pool of water. The Stop-N-Go was more like a dirty, dusty, quick stop for gas. There was a little Indian girl with her mom. The little girl was curious and wanted to come over, but her mom pulled her away. The mother didn't trust us I am sure. I smiled at the little girl and she shyly waved back.



The one thing I had noticed on this trip, is children and people 60 and older were curious and anxious, to get us into conversation! Going down the highway little kids would wave, until they were out of sight. People over 60 would wave and give thumbs up, and follow till we stopped. Old men, in particular, would get excited and look the trikes over asking questions. Hey, isn't that a VW motor? How did you do the wiring? Isn't this a spare gas tank? More than one said they were going home to build a trike. I loved to see the excitement on their face as they scratched their heads and a big smile spread from ear to ear. And, then, there were those that totally ignored us! The ones most likely to pretend to not see us were those between 30 and 55 years of age. Could someone explain that ?



Once we stopped for a soda at a little town along Route 66. We were relaxing on our bikes enjoying our soda in front of a laundromat, (I think), when a lady came out. I had seen her looking at us through the window. She must have been between 75 and 80. Neatly done gray hair, house dress, brown flats, and a twinkle in her eyes. I liked her immediately. She came slowly toward me, keeping her eyes on my trike. She walked past, then turned back not taking her eyes off the trike once. It was like I wasn't there! I said "hello." She gave a shy smile and said, "Hello," but never took her eyes off the trike once. She didn't ask any questions, just

stood there and looked. I tried to make small talk, but her interest wasn't in talking. Finally, I said, "would you like a ride?" She didn't say yes or no.... just climbed into the back seat! I looked at Lee and gave a thumbs up! We didn't go far and I kept the speed to a crawl, just a nice ride up the frontage road and around the parking lot. I wondered if she would like to have gone fast, with wind in her hair? Ya, from the twinkle in her eyes I would say she would have been fun to have on this trip. I brought her back, and when we left, she waved and watched us go down the road. She hadn't said 6 words, I couldn't even say I remember her voice, but the look on her face was worth a thousand words. In that short exchange with her I felt like I was leaving a friend behind. It warmed my heart to think she would get on a trike, with a woman in leathers, and a complete stranger, to boot. As I think back, it dawns on me, for a few minutes on a very short ride, two strangers shared a Wild Woman Moment.

Before we left the Stop-N-Go, a couple who was putting gas in their car, watched us trying not to be obvious that they were looking. Curiosity won and they came over. Wow they were in their forties! The woman's first question was "won't you get into trouble for riding those things?" Lee and I glanced at one another. Of all the questions asked along the way that was a first. I am sure we looked surprised. Lee asked, "Why would you ask that?" "Those, pointing to our trikes, are against the law," she said. We laughed and said "no they aren't against the law." "They are in Sweden," she said, with authority. She was impressed enough to have her picture taken with Lee and his trike. Bet that was the vacation picture she showed off the most. She and an outlaw triker. Imagine her surprise to find out there is BTW Swedish chapter. BTW being Brothers of the Third Wheel. It is an International Association for all trike riders. I am proud to be a member.

From Shiprock, we headed toward Farmington on Highway 550. It took a few miles down the road, before I noticed a subtle change in the landscape. I was beginning to see tufts of green, here and there. Pretty soon the right side of the road had green lawns, trees, and hayfields. The other side of the road was still brown desert and blowing sand. The difference was on the right side of the road, there was a river. Irrigation could be run to the fields, and the hay sold, as cash crops. The river provided an oasis for people living on the right side of the road. It was such a stark difference and I missed it once we turned away from the river.

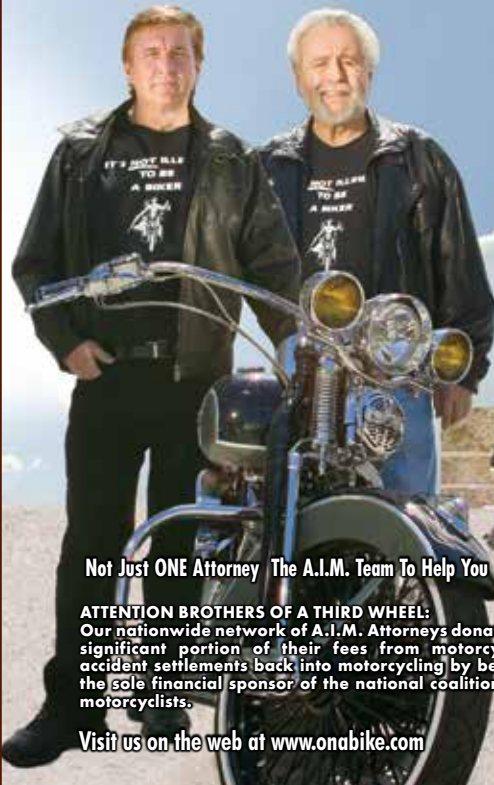

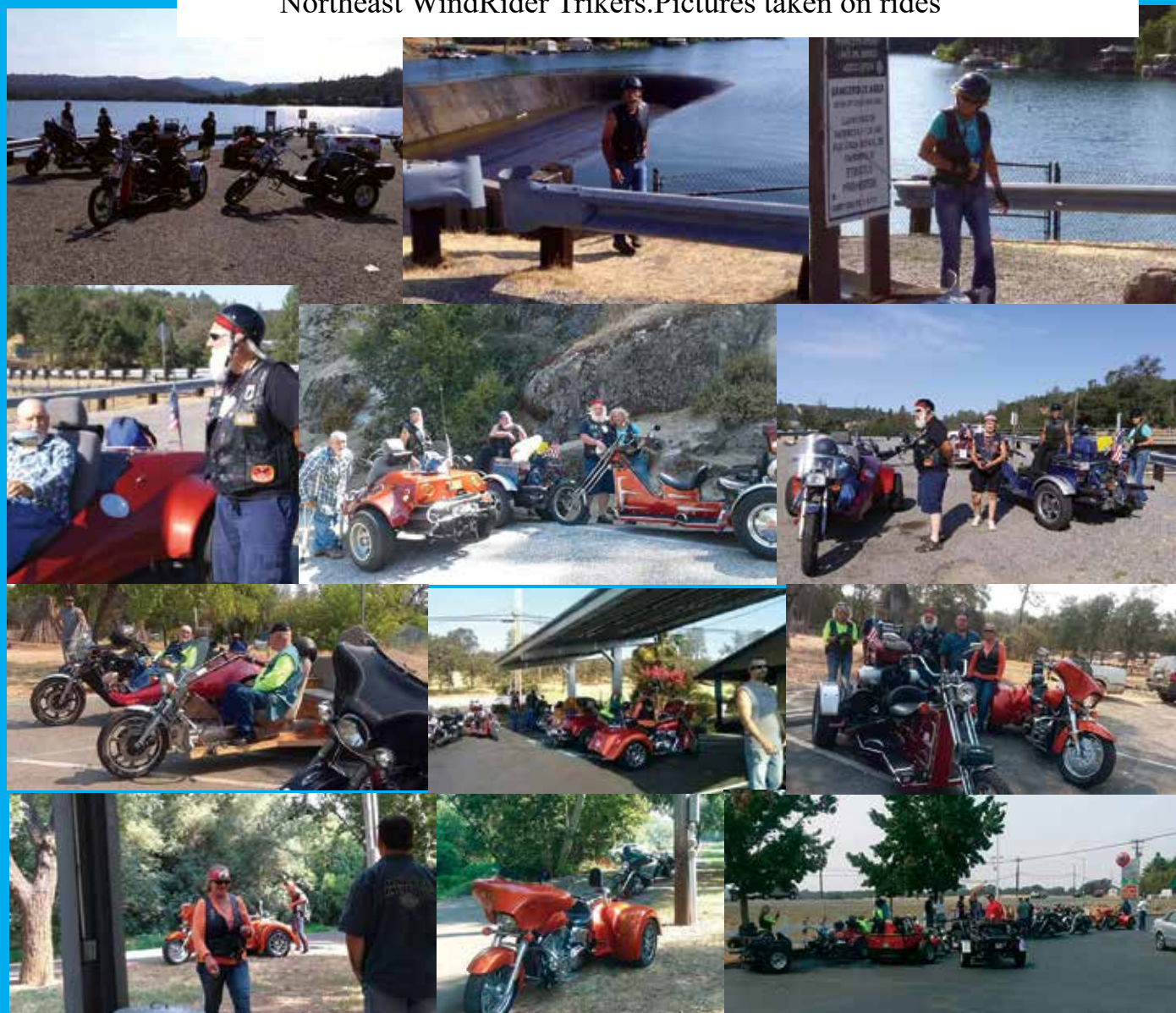

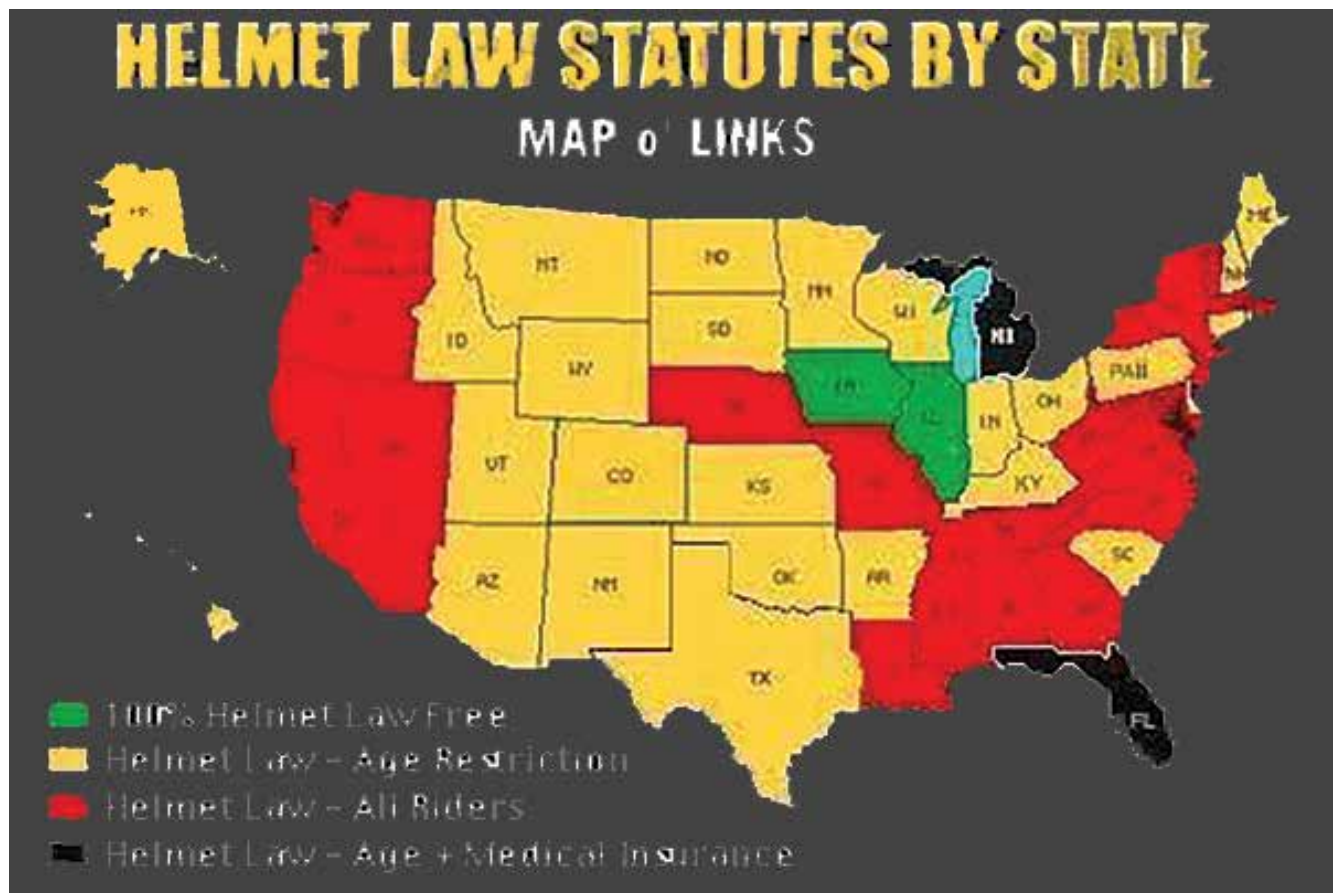

Hazard in Roadway
On the left, point with left hand; on the right, point with right foot.



Single File

BTW BOD Elections
