# FROM THE INDUSTRY

## ELECTRIC TRIKES

Every so often, an automaker presents a concept vehicle that is outside of the box. The idea of the concept really is to gauge public interest and reaction, though production is not necessarily a consideration. Honda has unveiled an interesting electric drive concept that could trigger positive response.

The concept is called the Honda 3R-C. It's basically an electrically driven trike, but with a wild twist. When the vehicle is parked, it looks like a futuristic, enclosed motorcycle. Its width is slightly more than a motorcycle and its length is close as well. When the vehicle is occupied, the vehicle expands to become a full blown trike. The overhead canopy opens to become a windshield and the 3R-C is ready for action.

The concept was built as a way to illustrate how vehicle can conform to overly crowded city situations. The Honda concept ensures occupant safety via a high-sided safety seat. The batteries are located in the lower portion of the chassis to give the concept a low center of gravity and strong handling attributes.

Though only a concept, the Honda 3R-C certainly looks intriguing. In many ways it appears similar to the Nissan Land Glider concept shown at last years Tokyo Motor Show. Perhaps both Honda and Nissan are on to something here. Take a small electric drive vehicle, give it great handling, futuristic looks, and the ability to park virtually anywhere and you have an unbeatable urban runabout.



# FROM THE INDUSTRY

## Arcimoto

Arcimoto is an American electric vehicle manufacturer. The company offers many different electric trike motorcycles, which include the FUV (Fun Utility Vehicle), the Rapid Responder, the Deliverator, and the Roadster.

Designed for commuting, the FUV features a windscreen, panoramic roof, and removable doors. It can carry 2 passengers and offers a range of 100 “city” miles on one charge. This model is powered by an 81 HP electric engine and a 20kWh battery pack.

Although it’s still just a prototype, we have to mention the company’s new invention, the Roadster. As its name suggests, this trike is designed for recreational use. It features a motorcycle-like seat for 2 passengers and lacks a roof and windshield.

Harold Atterberry has been scheduling Tucson Trikers breakfast rides for our chapter of BTW every Wednesday for a couple of years now. In Tucson we ride year-round, but temperatures dictate our meetup and departure time. In the winter we do brunch rides to give the sun a couple hours to take the chill out of the air. It's usually in the 50's when we take off. In the summer, it's all about beating the heat, when daytime highs can exceed 100 Dry-Heat Degrees, we meet while it's still in the 70's.



Our destinations seem to be shorter in the summer for the same reason; it gets hot by noon. There are a number of BTW favorite destinations around Tucson and sometimes we will take the scenic route to get there. We

usually meet at the same place on Cortaro Rd, which isn't too far from Saguaro National Park on Tucson's west side. The park is especially beautiful in the morning at sunrise, riding over Gates Pass and doing the McCain loop to highlight some of the Sonoran desert's most scenic vistas.

During the cooler months we will venture beyond Tucson in just about any direction. There are a number of great restaurants south in Green Valley or near the Mexican border in Amado, Arivaca and Tubac, Arizona. We will often head south along Mission Road, which is now freshly repaved and a joy to ride past the historic San Xavier Mission and Duval Mine. To the north we head to Casa Grande and San Tan Flat, close to Phoenix.



Our group has a number of custom and unique trikes. A few of the riders have Harley Tri Glides. Bondo Bob builds custom trikes with serious V-8 power and Ice man's Venom has a V-6 from a Buick Grand National

Pace car! There are a number of Can Am Spyder's and a Polaris Slingshot in the group and we have the leaning three-wheel Yamaha Niken GT. Our friends on two wheels are always welcome to join us and Natvman does so regularly on his Harley or Indian Scout. Most of us really look forward to our Hump-Day sorties to breakfast. If you find yourself in the Tucson area, please join us!

IF YOU TAKE PHOTOS WITH YOUR PHONE AND IT IS SET AT 72 PIXELS IT IS THE LOWEST QUALITY OF PICTURE THAT THE PHONE PRODUCES. MOST PHONES CAN BE SET TO A GREATER PIXEL OUTPUT.

EACH PHONE SETTING IS DIFFERENT, HOWEVER YOUR SERVICE PROVIDER CAN HELP WITH HOW THAT IS DONE. A SETTING OF 150 PIXELS IS GOOD AND 200 PIXELS WILL GIVE YOU A BEAUTIFUL PHOTO, THAT WILL NOT BE GRAINY AND THE COLORS WILL BE TRUE AND SHARP. PHOTOS THAT WE RECEIVE AT HQ IN 72 PIXELS ARE RUN THROUGH A PROGRAM TO CLEAN THEM UP BUT NOT MUCH HAPPENS AS THE BASE IS SO LOW THAT THE PROGRAM CAN ONLY LIGHTEN OR DARKEN THEM. THIS IS JUST A TIP SO WE CAN POST BETTER PICTURES IN THE MAGAZINE TO MAKE YOUR TRIKE LOOK ITS BEST AND OF COURSE YOU AS WELL. HOWEVER IN MY CASE IT WOULD TAKE MORE THAN MORE PIXELS TO MAKE ME LOOK GOOD

## MOTORCYCLE HAND SIGNALS



### LEFT TURN

Arm and hand extending left, palm facing down



### RIGHT TURN

Arm out bent at 90° angle up with fist clenched



### STOP

Arm out bent at 90° angle down with palm facing back



### SLOW DOWN

Arm extended straight out with palm facing down while swinging arm down



### SPEED UP

Arm extended straight out with palm facing up while swinging arm upward



### HAZARD IN ROAD

On left point with left hand  
On right point with right foot



### FOLLOW ME

Arm extended straight up with palm facing forward



### COME AROUND/ TAKE THE LEAD

Arm extended index finger pointing out while swinging arc from back to front



### PULL OFF

Arm extended index finger pointing out while swinging arc from left to over head



### SINGLE FILE

Arm straight up with index finger pointed up



### DOUBLE FILE

Arm straight up with index finger and middle finger up



### RIDE STAGGERED

Arm straight up with index finger and pinky up



### FUEL STOP

Point to fuel tank



### COMFORT STOP

Arm extended with clenched fist with short up and down motion



### REFRESHMENT STOP

Fingers closed with thumb to mouth

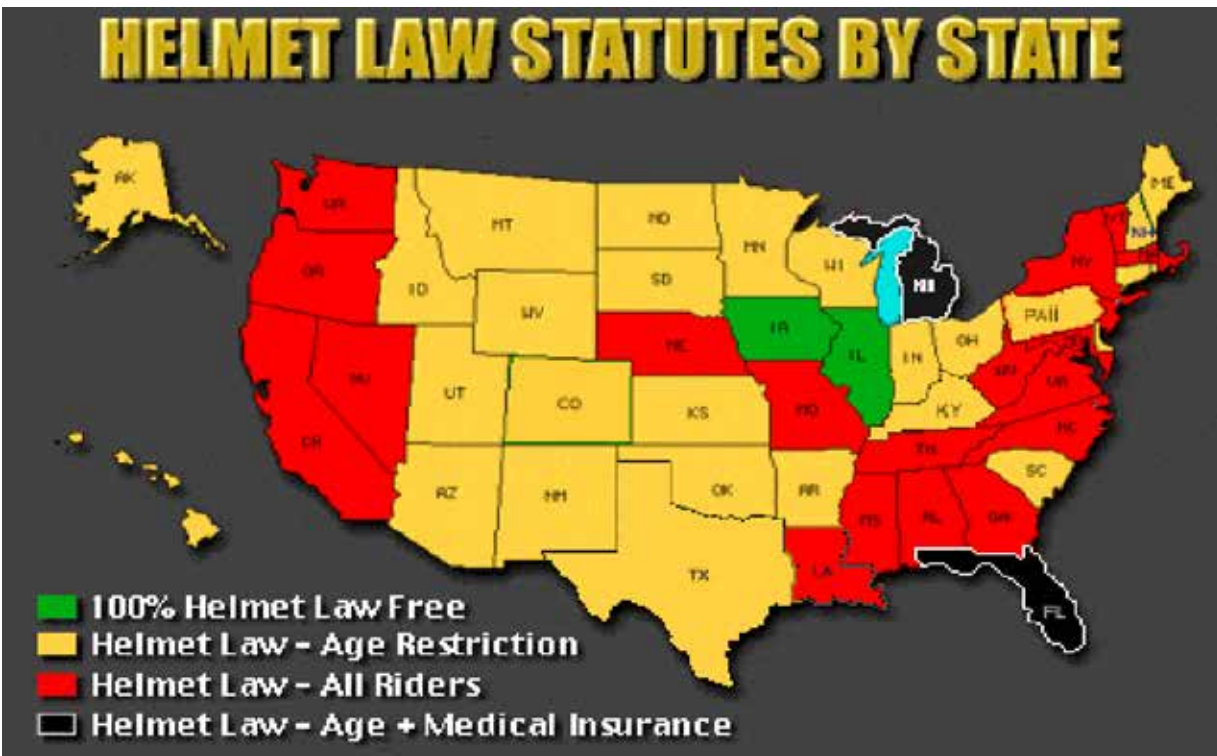

### •Footnotes

1. Alaska's motorcycle helmet use law covers passengers of all ages, operators younger than 18, and operators with instructional permits.
- 2 In Delaware, every motorcycle operator or rider age 19 and older must carry an approved helmet.
- 3 In Florida, the law requires that all riders younger than 21 years wear helmets, without exception. Those 21 years and older may ride without helmets only if they can show proof that they are covered by a medical insurance policy.
- 4 In Kentucky, motorcycle helmet laws also cover operators with instructional/learner's permits.
- 5 Motorcycle helmet laws in Maine cover operators with instructional/learner's permits and operators in their first year of licensure. Maine's motorcycle helmet use law also covers passengers 17 and younger and passengers riding with operators who are required to wear a helmet.
- 6 In Michigan, the law requires that all riders younger than 21 wear helmets, without exception. Those 21 and older may ride without helmets only if they carry additional insurance and have passed a motorcycle safety course or have had their motorcycle endorsement for at least two years. Motorcycle passengers who want to exercise this option also must be 21 or older and carry additional insurance.
- 7 Motorcycle helmet laws in Minnesota cover operators with instructional/learner's permits.
- 8 In Missouri, riders younger than 26 and instruction permit holders, regardless of age, must wear protective headgear when the vehicle is in motion. Operators who are 26 and older may operate a motorcycle without protective headgear if they maintain proof of financial responsibility. No person shall be stopped, inspected, or detained solely to determine compliance.
- 9 North Dakota's motorcycle helmet use law covers all passengers traveling with operators who are covered by the law.
- 10 Ohio's motorcycle helmet use law covers all operators during the first year of licensure and all passengers of operators who are covered by the law.
- 11 Pennsylvania's motorcycle helmet use law covers all operators during the first two years of licensure unless the operator has completed the safety course approved by PennDOT or the Motorcycle Safety Foundation.
- 12 Rhode Island's motorcycle helmet use law covers all passengers (regardless of age) and all operators during the first year of licensure (regardless of age).
- 13 Texas exempts riders 21 or older if they can either show proof of successfully completing a motorcycle operator training & safety course or can show proof of having a medical insurance policy. Peace officers may not stop or detain a person who is the operator of or a passenger on a motorcycle for the sole purpose of determining whether the person has successfully completed the motorcycle operator training and safety course or is covered by a health insurance plan.
- 14 Motorcycle helmet laws in Wisconsin cover operators with instructional/learner's permits.

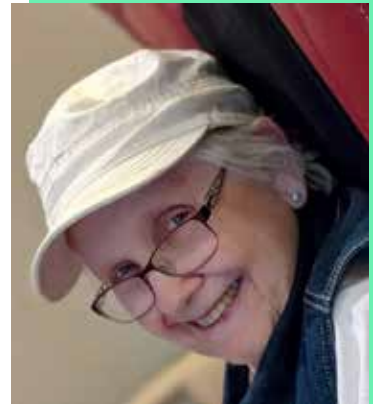
# In Memory of Trikers Lost

## **BTW BOD Elections**
